UNH MOMENTUM BUILDS TO SIX STRAIGHT WINS *Six other teams mull split week in league play*

Little changed in the Hockey East standings from last week as six of the eight teams posted one win and one loss in league play. The UNH Wildcats were one exception, running their winning streak to six straight by downing BU 5-0 and Vermont 4-1. Shannon Clement dominated the BU win, registering a hat trick and one assist. Jennifer Hitchcock led the way at UVM with a pair of power play goals spaced just 3:47 apart. Goaltender Melissa Bourdon remained relatively untested in turning aside 22 of the 23 shots she faced over the two contests.

Boston University rebounded from the UNH loss to post arguably its biggest win of the season, 2-1 over three-time defending champ Providence. A short-handed breakaway goal by rookie Nicki Wiart midway through the third stood up as the game-winner.

Undaunted, Providence picked up its game again on Sunday at Boston College to collect a 4-2 win. Sonny Watrous scored twice to lead the way. The Eagles came into the contest riding high from Saturday's convincing 6-1 road win at UConn in which freshman Becky Zavisza scored two goals and added two assists. UConn picked up its win on the week with a 4-0 victory vs. Vermont. Sniper Jaclyn Hawkins scored two goals while Kaitlyn Shain needed to make just 12 saves for the shutout.

Northeastern and Maine split a two-game set in Boston. NU overcame a 2-0 deficit with four third-period goals in Saturday's 4-2 win, but Maine struck back with a 3-2 win in the rematch. NU also picked up a win earlier in the week, beating Brown 4-2. Junior Crystal Rochon contributed a goal in each game.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles' six goals Saturday at UConn was a season high. It was also their first road win of the season ... Rookie Maggie Taverna has scored at least one point in each of the last six games of the season ... Sophomore Deb Spillane broke a moderate slump Saturday, potting two goals, her first since Nov. 5.

Boston University: Freshman Allyse Wilcox is second in the nation in saves (446), trailing only Northeastern's Marisa Hourihan ... The Terriers have outscored their opponents 22-12 in the third period this season.

University of Connecticut: Katherine Van Deveire scored the only UConn goal, her first goal of the season, in a 6-1 loss to Boston College ... The line of Jena Danzig, Leslie Hurlburt and Kristen Russell combined for six points over the weekend.

University of Maine: Two defensemen (Julie Poulin and Kelly Law) are tied with forward Cheryl White for the Black Bear lead in points this season (14). Poulin led all Maine blueliners last year with 11 total points in 29 games, while Law registered just seven points on the season. The Maine record for points by a defenseman in one season is 24, set by Kelly Nelson in the 2000-01 season.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has not allowed more than 16 shots in its last eight games. They have limited opponents to fewer than five shots in a period 19 times this season ... Melissa Bourdon's recently ended a shutout streak of 131:01 ... UNH's penalty kill has been successful in 16 of 17 shorthanded situations (94.1%) in the last five games, and have two short-handed goals in that span. On the season, they lead the nation with five short-handers.

Northeastern University: After scoring just one point in the previous five games, the line of Amy Goodney, Nikki Petrich and Crystal Rochon scored seven of NU's 10 goals last week and totalled 13 points ... NU's consecutive wins over Brown and Maine marked the first time in head coach Laura Schuler's tenure that the Huskies have won back-to-back games ... Three of NU's four wins this season have been come-from-behind victories ... Eight of NU's 10 goals last week were scored in the third period.

Providence College: Kristin Gigliotti continues to blaze the ice as she currently rides a career-high 13-game scoring streak. She has five goals and seven assists in the last 10 ten games and leads the nation in goals by a defenseman (9) ... The Friars suffered their first loss of the season at Schneider Arena with a 6-3 loss to Harvard Wednesday, breaking an 11-game home unbeaten streak dating to last season.

University of Vermont: Sophomore Karen Sentoff scored her first goal of the season versus New Hampshire on Sunday ... Sunday's game was the start of a lengthy home stand for Vermont. The Catamounts will play their next four games (and nine of their next 11) on home ice ... Vermont has scored only three goals over its last five games, all losses.
