UNH STREAK SLOWED IN WILD WEEKEND AT MAINE *Three wins by BC Eagles move them into a tie for first place*

They're still undefeated in 13 games, but the UNH Wildcats' 11-game win streak was halted in Friday's 5-5 tie at Maine. Maine notched three power play goals in the third period to take a brief 5-4 lead before UNH's Shannon Clement tied it with just 1:15 remaining in regulation to complete her second hat trick of the season. Maine's Patricia Gagnon had two goals and one assist in her NCAA debut, and added another goal and another assist in Saturday's rematch, a 5-3 UNH win. UNH's Jennifer Hitchcock had another big week, totalling three goals and three assists over three games, including a 5-1 win over Harvard on Wednesday. Clement had a goal and an assist in the triumph over the Crimson and goaltender Melissa Bourdon stopped 23 of 24 shots faced.

Deb Spillane led the BC offense to three straight league wins, one vs. Northeastern and two vs. Vermont. Spillane had at least one goal in each game and totalled four of the eight Eagle goals on the week, as BC moved into a first-place tie with UNH. The Eagles have a modest 9-7-4 overall record, but have an impressive 8-2-1 record in league play, including a win over UNH.

Providence is right on the heels of the league leaders, and notched a win and a tie vs. Minnesota State this past weekend. Karen Thatcher was a catalyst in both contests, scoring twice in Saturday's 3-3 tie and pacing the attack with a goal and three assists in Sunday's 6-2 win. Sophomore blueliner Kathleen Smith was Sunday's most dominant player on the scoresheet, however, registering five points on two goals and three assists.

Rookie stopper Allyse Wilcox notched the first shutout in BU hockey history Sunday, stopping UConn cold on 23 shots en route to a 3-0 win. The Huskies had their own rookie goaltender come up big a day earlier, as Brittany Wilson stopped 30 of 31 shots faced in a 1-1 tie at Dartmouth.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles are currently on a three game win streak, their longest of the season. They own a share of first place in Hockey East for the first time ever ... Johanna Ellison's first career shutout Friday was also BC's first of the season ... The top five scorers for the Eagles are all underclassmen (sophomores and freshmen).

Boston University: Freshman Laurel Koller's first period goal snapped a 134:11 scoreless streak for BU against UConn goaltender Kaitlyn Shain ... The Terriers' 88.3 percent penalty kill rate is fourth best in the nation and first among Hockey East teams.

University of Connecticut: Saturday's 1-1 deadlock at Dartmouth was the Huskies' first tie of the season. It was just the third appearance for freshman goaltender Brittany Wilson ... Freshman Kristen Russell picked up assists on both of the UConn goals that were scored this week and is currently second on the team with 14 points.

University of Maine: The Black Bears extended their home undefeated streak to 6-0-3 with a 5-5 tie vs. top-ranked UNH on Friday night, but the Wildcats ended the streak on Saturday ... The new line of Sonia Corriveau, Brigitte Laflamme and Patricia Gagnon generated six of the eight Maine goals this weekend vs. a stingy UNH defense that had only given up three goals in the last five games. All three players are natives of Quebec. Gagnon, in her first NCAA appearances, had three of those six goals, one on the power play, one short-handed and one at even strength.

University of New Hampshire: UNH now has a 13-game unbeaten streak, its longest since an 11-0-2 run in 1997-98 ... Jennifer Hitchcock has nine goals and nine assists during an active eight-game point streak. Sadie Wright-Ward shares the streak with seven goals and five assists in the same span ... UNH has not been outshot this season ... UNH has a home winning streak of eight games and a home unbeaten streak of 15 (12-0-3).

Northeastern University: The NU penalty kill had stopped 14 straight power plays before RPI's first-period power-play tally on Friday ... The 19 shots allowed to RPI was the lowest total by an NU opponent this season. It was just the fourth time this year that NU has outshot its opponent ... Crystal Rochon leads the Huskies in power-play goals (2), shorthanded goals (2) and even-strength goals (7). Her 11 goals are a career high.

Providence College: Senior Karen Thatcher reached the 150-point plateau this weekend, becoming just the 14th Friar to do so. Senior Ashley Payton needs just one more point to reach 100 ... Ten of the Friars' 12 wins have come when PC scores four goals or more ... Sophomore Rachel Crissy netted her first career short-hander in Sunday's 6-2 win over Minnesota State.

University of Vermont: Vermont's last 10 goals have been scored by 10 different players ... 19 of the Catamounts' 24 goals scored this season have come at home ... Vermont is 2-4-1 when scoring first this season and 0-15-1 when the opponent scores first.

COMING UP ...

The new trend for the women's Hockey East league is to play every day. Eighteen of the first 22 days of the new year feature at least one game involving a Hockey East team. This coming week, Thursday is the only day off.

Boston College has a full plate with four league games on tap, beginning with Monday's noontime contest at Vermont. BC swept the visiting Catamounts just a few days ago, so this will be the last chance for UVM to earn a point against the Eagles this season. The Eagles then host Northeastern on Tuesday, followed by BU on Friday. The Eagles and Terriers wrap their first annual Hockey East series Saturday at BU. The first-ever varsity meeting between the two squads yielded a 3-3 tie on Oct. 18. BU will also take on Brown this week. Brown and BC are the only teams that have managed to tag UNH with a loss this year.

The top-ranked Wildcats enter the week on a 12-0-1 streak which included a 4-1 win at Dartmouth on Jan. 1. The Big Green look for redemption in a Friday night prime time faceoff at the Whittemore Center. Sunday highlights the first meeting of UNH and UConn since the Huskies ended the Wildcats' season in the Hockey East semifinals last year.

Providence will try to keep pace with the first-place Wildcats by taking on two Hockey East opponents, hosting Providence on Saturday afternoon and travelling to Maine for a Sunday afternoon faceoff.
