UNH ROLLS ON WITH WINS VS. MERCYHURST, PROVIDENCE *Wilson, UConn sweep Northeastern to gain edge in playoff race*

Reiterating their status as one of the best squads in the nation, the UNH Wildcats notched back-to-back victories vs. No. 6 Mercyhurst and No. 10 Providence last weekend, upping their undefeated streak to 17 straight games. Their 21-2-1 record this season has been blemished only by two one-goal losses early in the season and by a recent tie at Maine. Their victories have included four over traditional powerhouses Dartmouth and Harvard (two wins vs. each) and one each over Mercyhurst, Providence and Wisconsin.

Sophomore Sadie Wright-Ward led the 'Cats this weekend with the game-winning score in the final minute of a 2-1 win over Mercyhurst. She added another goal and one assist in a dominating 7-2 triumph vs. archrival Providence. Defenseman Martine Garland had three assists during a four-goal outburst for UNH in the second period vs. Providence and also set up a goal in the Mercyhurst win. Goaltender Melissa Bourdon stopped 30 of 33 shots faced on the weekend to finish off a strong January at 8-0-1 with a 1.32 goals-against-average and a .923 save percentage.

UConn's Brittany Wilson came out of the shadow behind All-Star stopper Kaitlyn Shain this past weekend to record back-to-back wins vs. Northeastern. She totalled 57 saves on 60 shots faced, including 28 of 30 in Saturday's narrow 3-2 road win. UConn poured on the offense in Sunday's rematch at home, scoring a total of 10 goals vs. three different NU goaltenders. Jaclyn Hawkins had a goal in each game and chipped in three assists over the two games while rookie teammate Kristen Russell exploded for two goals and two assists in the 10-1 triumph and finished with six points in the sweep.

The Maine Black Bears overpowered the visiting BU Terriers in their first-ever meeting, cruising to a 7-0 victory at home on Saturday. Rookie Vanessa Vani led the way with two power play goals and one assist. Vermont finally put an end to a 13-game losing streak by toppling the RPI Engineers on Sunday, 4-3. In a strong group effort, nine different Catamounts notched exactly one point.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles' seven-game win streak ended with a 5-2 loss to No. 6 Mercyhurst ... Sarah Feldman has tallied at least one point in the last eight games for the Eagles ... Sophomore Cristin Stuart moved to forward from defense for the game against Mercyhurst and scored her first goal of the season.

Boston University: The Terriers have only six unassisted goals, while allowing 15 ... BU is out scoring opponents 26-19 in the third period.

University of Connecticut: UConn's 10-1 victory vs. Northeastern Sunday marked the largest margin of victory and the most goals ever scored for the Huskies against a Div.-I opponent. It was also just the second time this season they have scored more than three goals in a game.

University of Maine: Maine's seven goals vs. BU Saturday was its most ever against a Hockey East opponent ... The Black Bears have not been shut out in their last 29 games, but have recorded five shutouts in that same span ... Maine was perfect on the penalty kill for the 12th time this season Saturday, keeping the Terriers scoreless on six opportunities.

University of New Hampshire: In five games against nationally-ranked teams this season, goaltender Melissa Bourdon is 5-0-0 with a 1.00 GAA, .944 save percentage and one shutout. The team has outscored the opposition 19-5 in those games ... Both Jennifer Hitchcock and Sadie Wright-Ward have extended their mutual point-scoring streaks to 12 straight games. Hitchcock has 10 goals and 23 points while Wright-Ward has 12 goals and 19 points in that span.

Northeastern University: Sunday's contest broke a streak of three straight one-goal losses for the Huskies ... Sarah Belliveau's appearance in the first period Sunday broke a streak of 968:14 that Marisa Hourihan was the lone NU goalie between the pipes. Katy Augustyn also played on Sunday, marking her first appearance since Feb. 6, 2004. Hourihan played every minute in 2004-05 ... After registering just two points in her first 22 games this season, junior Marie Desrosiers has scored two goals and an assist in her last three.

Providence College: The Friars are 10-2-1 on the season when leading after the first period ... Kristin Gigliotti and Karen Thatcher are tied for third in the nation with seven power play goals each this season.

University of Vermont: Nine different players registered exactly one point in Sunday's 4-3 win vs. RPI. No UVM player had more than one point. The first goal, by Danielle Ramirez, extended a streak in which the last 11 UVM goals were scored by 11 different players ... UVM's first goal in Sunday's game broke a scoreless streak of 235:12 for the Catamounts. The four goals marked a season-high.

COMING UP ...

The UNH Wildcats will transition from one big week to another over the next several days, as they visit Providence and Boston College. Back-to-back home wins vs. No. 6 Mercyhurst (2-1) and the archrival Friars (7-2) this past week were challenging enough, but their 17-game undefeated streak (16-0-1) will be tested again over the next two contests, both on the road. The Wildcats own Providence at the Whittemore Center (10-0-2 in the last 12 meetings) but the tables are turned at PC's Schneider Arena, where the host Friars have a 3-6-3 record in the same span. If the 'Cats get by that one (Wednesday night), they'll put the streak on the line again Saturday at BC, site of their only loss in league play this season. And with BC currently four points ahead of UNH in the Hockey East standings, the stakes will be ratcheted up even more.

Of equal importance this weekend is Maine's two game set at UConn. Maine is two points behind for the final playoff spot, but has a game in hand. BU is tied for fifth with Maine, but has played three more games. The Terriers host Northeastern on Saturday.

Providence hopes to solidify its position with two games at Vermont, but the Catamounts are fresh off a confidence-boosting win over Rensselaer, their first win in 14 games.
