TWO BIG ROAD WINS SETTLE UNH INTO A TIE FOR FIRST *Maine, UConn trade wins to ignite rush for final playoff spot*

The UNH Wildcats are not only the hottest team in Hockey East, but in the nation as well. Undefeated in their last 19 games, the 'Cats have won seven straight, three of the last four coming vs. ranked opponents. Last week, UNH passed two more tests with a narrow 2-1 win at Providence, the three-time defending league champ, followed by a dominating 6-1 win at first-place Boston College, site of their last loss way back on Nov. 5. Rookie Samantha Faber continues to contribute heavily, notching the game-winning goal short-handed in the third period at Providence, and adding a goal and two assists in the win at BC. Both Jennifer Hitchcock and Sadie Wright-Ward extended their shared point streak to 14 games. Goaltender Melissa Bourdon upped her record to 6-0 this year vs. ranked opponents and allowed just one goal in each of the two road wins last week.

Providence rebounded from the loss well, notching back-to-back wins at Vermont. Both Katelynn Laffin (two goals, two assists) and Karen Thatcher (three assists) had big outings vs. UVM on Sunday, but Sonny Watrous led all scorers on the weekend with three goals and two assists over the two games.

Beanpot participants Boston University and Northeastern went head-to-head Saturday, and the visiting Huskies emerged victorious, thanks in large part to 42 saves by Marisa Hourihan. Jessica Copney and Marie Desrosiers hooked up on two goals in the game's closing minutes to secure the win.

With just a handful of games remaining for each team, BC, UNH and Providence look secure headed into the playoffs, while Northeastern and Vermont will have to wait until next year for a postseason berth. Boston University may need a little help with two teams ahead of them fighting for fourth place. Those two teams, UConn and Maine, traded wins this past weekend in a key series. Host UConn controlled Saturday's opener and cruised to a 5-1 victory, getting four points from sniper Jaclyn Hawkins. The Black Bears struck back in the rematch, narrowly defeating UConn 2-1. Linemates Brigitte Laflamme and Patricia Gagnon each had a hand in each of the three Maine goals on the weekend. UConn goalie Kaitlyn Shain saw plenty of action, stopping 53 of 56 shots in the split.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC has five goals in the last three goals, all by defensemen. Cristin Stuart has two of those, her first two of the season ... BC went 7-for-8 on the penalty kill over its last two games, vs. No. 2 UNH and No. 6 Mercyhurst.

Boston University: Catherine Foley scored her first collegiate goal Saturday vs. Northeastern ... Hockey East opponents have scored 15 power-play goals against BU while non-conference opponents have scored only six ... 12 Terriers players have recorded at least one power-play goal and seven have scored at least two. Five of Cara Hendry's seven goals have come with the man advantage.

University of Connecticut: The Huskies scored two short-handed goals in Saturday's 5-1 win vs. Maine victory ... UConn had six penalties to Maine's two on Sunday, marking just the second time this season that the Huskies have had more penalties than their opponent.

University of Maine: The Black Bears are 13-5-4 when outshooting their opponents ... The line combination of Sonia Corriveau, Patricia Gagnon and Brigitte Laflamme has combined for 28 goals and 26 assists this season. Gagnon, a second semester addition, has nine points in her first seven games played.

University of New Hampshire: The Wildcats are 3-2 in one-goal games this year, with all three wins coming against ranked opponents ... UNH has outscored the opposition 43-8 in the second period this season ... UNH has recorded 30 or more shots in 20 of 26 games this season and has held the opposition to fewer than 20 shots 21 times ... Jennifer Hitchcock and Sadie Wright-Ward extended their shared point streak to 14 games. Hitchcock has 27 points during the streak and Wright-Ward has 22.

Northeastern University: Marie Desrosiers has three goals and two assists in her last four games after picking up just two points in her first 22 games this season ... Of Jessica Coppney's four goals this season, two have been game-winners ... Ashley Bielawski has scored four of her nine goals this season against BU ... 12 of Northeastern's 25 games this season have been decided by one goal or less ... Saturday's game broke a nine-game losing streak.

Providence College: The Friars are 14-1-2 when scoring at least three goals, and 1-8-2 when held to one goal or less ... Kristin Gigliotti leads all defensemen in the nation with 32 points. She has nearly twice as many goals (15) as the next closest blueliner ... Sonny Watrous needs just one point to reach 100 in her career.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts are undefeated (2-0-2) when scoring three goals or more, but have just one win (1-23-0) when held to less than three goals. Vermont is 47-1-5 over the last 10 years when putting three or more goals on the board ... Seniors Caitlin Barnes, Abbey Kaknes and Lindsey Tilbury are each one game shy of the all-time games played record in UVM history (127), currently shared by Betsy Ammel and Jackie Duerr.

COMING UP ...

The race for the Hockey East playoffs has reached its crescendo, and the coming weeks will determine how it all shakes down. With three teams relatively comfortable at the top of the standings, the biggest battle will be for the fourth and final playoff spot. Boston University has an outside shot if they can win their final four league games, including Saturday at Providence, but UConn and Maine hold the trump cards ahead of the Terriers with games in hand.

Of the two, Maine certainly has the better draw this coming weekend, hosting two games against Vermont. The Catamounts have just one win and one tie in 15 league games this year, but they'll do their best to be spoilers. UConn, on the other hand, hosts Boston College, who is tied with UNH for first place.

It may not be quite there yet, but the women's Beanpot will soon be as exciting as the men's, as all four participating schools are on the rise. BC is tied for first place in Hockey East and BU has been exceptionally competitive for a first-year program. Northeastern and Harvard are the tournament's traditional powers, but that power will have to be shared with BC and BU from now on. The annual event will take place at Harvard this year, with the first round set to go on Tuesday.
