### WHITE, TURGEON LEAD MAINE TO SWEEP *Unbeaten streak delivering UNH to postseason as favorite*

With little fanfare, the University of Maine Black Bears have pulled even with UConn in the playoff race and claim both the tiebreaker advantage and a slightly easier remaining schedule. A sweep against Vermont gave Maine four points in the standings, placing them in a dead heat with UConn for the fourth and final playoff berth in Hockey East. The Black Bears were led by Cheryl White, who notched two goals in each game, and Genevieve Turgeon, who needed to stop just 25 shots over the two contests to record back-to-back shutouts. Rookie Vanessa Vani set up five of Maine's 10 goals on the weekend.

UConn had just one game on the week and was taken out 4-0 by Boston College. Johanna Ellison had 14 saves for the Eagle shutout. BC posted a thrilling victory earlier in the week, opening a night of Beanpot memories with a 4-3 OT win over Northeastern. BC defenseman Cristin Stuart set up three of the four BC goals, including rookie Meghan Fardelmann's winner. Northeastern's Marisa Hourihan rang up 44 saves in the game, while teammate Crystal Rochon and Erin Reil had a hand in each of the three NU goals.

In the other Beanpot semifinal, BU narrowly missed defeating host Harvard, falling 2-1 in overtime. The Terriers were then dismissed by Providence on Saturday by a 6-1 final. PC's Karen Thatcher had four assists in the game and scored the Friars' only goal on Sunday at UNH. The Wildcats' 4-1 win extended their unbeaten streak to 21 games and marked the first time in six years that either UNH or Providence has swept the season series between the two. UNH exploded in a Saturday match at Northeastern, unleashing a season-high 11 goals on the Huskies. Sadie Wright-Ward led the way with five points (one goal, four assists) but was held scoreless vs. PC Sunday to end a 15-game point streak shared with teammate Jennifer Hitchcock, who was also held with a point.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Sarah Feldman's two-goal game was her fourth of the season. She is tied for the team lead with 13 goals this year ... Defenseman Cristin Stuart is enjoying a modest four-game point streak ... Sophomore Deb Spillane is six points shy of her impressive rookie total of 36 points.

**Boston University:** BU's elevation to varsity status makes this the first women's Beanpot to feature four varsity squads. Rookie Laurel Koller scored the first Beanpot goal for BU's varsity program and BU narrowly missed its first first-round Beanpot win since 1983, dropping a 2-1 OT loss to host Harvard ... Junior transfer Cara Hendry needs just one point to reach her combined point total from her first two seasons.

**University of Connecticut:** UConn suffered a season series sweep at the hands of Boston College, losing 4-0 on Saturday. The Huskies scored just two goals in the three game set.

**University of Maine:** Maine's back-to-back shutouts this past weekend were the program's first since the 2001-02 season, also against Vermont ... With 24 points this season, Julie Poulin has tied Kelly Nelson for the single-season school record for points by a defenseman. Fellow blueliner Kelly Law is just one point behind ... Maine is one win away from tying the school record for most wins in a season (16), set in the 2001-02 season.

**University of New Hampshire:** After each notching at least one point in 15 straight games, both Jennifer Hitchcock and Sadie Wright-Ward were held scoreless vs. Providence on Sunday ... UNH's 11 goals at Northeastern was the team's highest total since Feb. 12, 2000, when the 'Cats recorded a 12-2 win vs. Yale ... UNH scored three power-play goals in both games last weekend and has reached that mark seven times this season ... In the last five games, UNH has outshot its opponents by an average of 43.6 to 14.2.

**Northeastern University:** Reil's three-point game was the first by a Husky defender since Kim Greene had three assists playing defense against Wayne State on Jan. 27, 2002 ... Crystal Rochon has three three-point games this season, two of them against BC ... Fourteen of Northeastern's 28 games this season have been decided by one goal or less, with the Huskies going 3-10-1 in those contests ... Six of Marie Desrosiers' eight points this season have come in the last six games.

**Providence College:** Jana Bugden's 40 saves at UNH Sunday was a career high ... Junior Sonny Watrous joined the Century Club this weekend with 100 career points. Karen Thatcher reached the 100-assist mark for her career with four vs. BU Saturday.

**University of Vermont:** Sunday's game vs. Maine marked the 128th career contest for seniors Caitlin Barnes, Abbey Kaknes and Lindsey Tilbury, breaking the previous UVM record shared by two former players ... Vermont was swept by Maine this season and outscored 12-0 in the process.

## COMING UP ...

Boston College enters the week with a chance to make history – their first-ever Beanpot championship. The first round last week was memorable, as both the Eagles and host Harvard required overtime to advance. The juggernaut Crimson (seven straight Beanpot titles) hasn't been as overpowering this season, but will have home ice in Tuesday's title game vs. BC. Following that, BC will split a home-and-home set vs. Providence in what could be a preview of a potential semifinal, a rematch of the 2005 pairing.

After a strong start in its inaugural season, BU is now barely hanging on to its Hockey East playoff hopes. The Terriers would need to win their remaining three games and get some help from teams above them. The most likely scenario would have Providence clinching one of the remaining two playoff berths and either UConn or Maine clinching the other. Maine put plenty of pressure on UConn this past weekend with a sweep vs. Vermont to pull even with the Huskies in the race for the final spot, and both teams have four tough games remaining on their respective schedules. Maine draws a two-game road trip at BU this coming weekend, not an easy task, but UConn has an even more difficult draw with a home-and-home series vs. top-ranked UNH.
