BC CELEBRATES 'POT TITLE WITH SWEEP OF PROVIDENCE Maine gets late goal from Gagnon in vital win at Boston University

In another mark of a breakout season for Boston College, the Eagles won their first-ever Beanpot title on Tuesday, defeating seven-time defending champ Harvard 2-0 on the Crimson's home ice. Tourney MVP Deb Spillane had both goals and Alison Quandt stopped all 23 shots she faced. As if that wasn't enough, the Eagles went on to sweep three-time defending Hockey East champ Providence in a home-and-home series to solidify their grip on second place in the standings and make a sizable jump in USCHO's Pairwise Rankings, which mimic the NCAA Tournament selection process. Becky Zavisza was the most consistent player against the Friars, scoring a goal and an assist in each game. Sonny Watrous scored all three Friar goals in the series vs. BC.

BC's sweep prevented UNH from clinching the regular season title, despite a sweep of its own vs. UConn. Rookie Samantha Faber had two goals in each game and added one assist to lead the Wildcat offense to wins of 5-1 and 6-0.

Maine turned up the heat in the playoff race by notching a late win at BU on Sunday. Rookie Patricia Gagnon netted the game-winning goal with just six seconds remaining to give the Black Bears a two-point edge on UConn for the fourth and final playoff spot. BU has been very successful for a first-year varsity program, with 12 wins so far, including its first win at the Beanpot since 1988 (3-1 vs. NU) and a win vs. Maine in the weekend split. Goaltending played a big role last week, as backup Karilyn Pilch stopped 26 of 27 NU shots for the 'Pot consolation win and starter Allyse Wilcox went 64-for-67 vs. Maine.

Northeastern's Marisa Hourihan got plenty of work as usual for the Huskies, facing 93 shots over three games on the week. She stopped 47 of 50 in the Beanpot consolation game, and then ended NU's league schedule on a high note with a sweep at Vermont, including a 23-save 3-0 shutout on Sunday.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Deb Spillane's two-goal game in the Beanpot finale was her fifth of the season ... Rookie Meghan Fardelmann had a point in each game last week and boasts a modest five-game streak ... Freshman defenseman Maggie Taverna has notched two short-handed goals in the past five games.

Boston University: Tuesday's win over NU in the Beanpot consolation game was the first Terrier win in Beanpot play since a 2-0 victory over BC in 1988. The win also snapped a seven-game winless streak in overall play ... Rookie Laurel Koller has 10 multiple-point games this season.

University of Connecticut: Kaitlyn Shain totalled 60 saves in five periods of play vs. top-ranked UNH this past weekend ... After scoring 15 goals over back-to-back games on Jan. 29 and Feb. 4, UConn has scored just two goals in the four games since.

University of Maine: The Black Bears have tied a school record for most wins in a single season (16) set in 2001-02 ... Kelly Law and Julie Poulin now share the team record for single-season points by a defenseman (25) with at least two games left to play.

University of New Hampshire: Six different Wildcats are averaging better than a point-per-game in Hockey East league play ... The 23-game unbeaten streak is the program's single-season record and ties the third longest mark overall ... UNH has allowed more than one goal in a game just once in its last 10 games ... UNH has won 12 consecutive road games, a single-season UNH record ... Sam Faber's 38 points is the highest total by a UNH rookie since Michelle Thornton's 44 in the 1997-98 season.

Northeastern University: NU's penalty kill is a perfect 19-for-19 over the last three games ... Erin Reil registered assists in all three games last week, and has one goal and six assists over the last five games ... After going winless in 29 straight road games over two seasons, the Huskies registered back-to-back road wins, over BU on Feb. 4 and over Vermont on Feb. 18.

Providence College: Junior forward Sonny Watrous is currently on a six-game point streak and has managed to score multiple points in four of those six. Watrous, Karen Thatcher and Kristin Gigliotti have each contributed seven power play goals this season ... PC went 10-for-11 on the penalty-kill vs. BC, and allowed just one power play shot on six chances for the Eagles on Saturday ... The Friars are 15-1-2 when scoring at least three goals. When held to two or fewer goals, they are 1-11-2.

University of Vermont: Sunday's contest marked the final home game for Catamount seniors Caitlin Barnes, Kate Hudspeth, Hilary Johnson, Abbey Kaknes and Lindsey Tilbury. Vermont's top four scorers are all seniors. Barnes is the team's leading scorer, but all of her points have come on assists.

COMING UP...

There's only one week remaining in the regular season, and it will offer a photo finish at the end.

Despite a 23-game unbeaten streak, UNH is only two points ahead of BC in the league standings. Nevertheless, the Wildcats need only two points to clinch a share of the regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the tourney. Chances are they'll find those points either against BU (Weds.) or at UVM (Sat./Sun.) BC will likely have to settle for second, but that's two spots higher than the Eagles' fourth-place finish last year.

Maine will try to sour BC's bright finish with a two-game set against the Eagles in Orono. The Black Bears have a two-point lead and the tiebreaker advantage over UConn for the fourth and final Hockey East playoff spot, and they trail third-place Providence by just two points.

The Providence-UConn home-and-home series will be the focus of the greatest drama. UConn technically controls its own destiny, as a sweep would lift the Huskies ahead of the Friars in the playoff race. Short of a sweep, however, UConn's chances dry up considerably. They would need a win and a tie against Providence and a sweep by BC at Maine in order to qualify for the tournament.
