MAINE, PROVIDENCE HEAD INTO PLAYOFFS UNH Wildcats rewrite record book with 26-game unbeaten streak

It was an impressive effort by the UConn Huskies in the final weekend, but in the end they were left out of the playoffs, just two points behind fourth-place Maine. The Huskies has to get at least three points in a home-and-home series vs. the Friars and a sweep would guarantee them a spot. UConn did its part Saturday at home, nearly shutting out Providence to set up Sunday's winner-take-all finale. The score was tied 2-2 headed into the third period, in which the Friars overpowered the Huskies with a 19-3 shot advantage, scoring three times. Both goaltenders were key in the series, with UConn's Kaitlyn Shain totalling 73 saves and Jana Bugden 54. Bugden allowed just two goals in each game. Sunday's win clinched playoff spots for both Providence and Maine. The Black Bears picked up a 4-1 win Saturday vs. BC, getting two goals each from Sonia Corriveau and Pam Patterson, before surrendering a 3-2 decision in Sunday's rematch.

Northeastern closed out its season with a split in a non-conference weekend vs. Niagara. Marisa Hourihan notched a 28-save shutout in Saturday's triumph over the Purple Eagles.

Boston University and Vermont both ended their seasons with a shutout suffered at the hands of top-ranked UNH. The Wildcats head into the playoffs on a 26-game unbeaten streak (25-0-1) and a shutout streak of 282:19, having blanked their last three opponents. They have re-written the Hockey East record book, establishing new single-season league marks for wins (19), offense (5.10 goals per game), power play (32.7), penalty killing (91.5), and a handful of others. Sophomore Sadie Wright-Ward won the league scoring title and established a new league record for points in a single season, with 39 in 21 games played, edging teammate Jennifer Hitchcock, who finishes with 38. Hitchcock prevailed in the ITECH Three Stars Award voting, however, with 21 points to 19 for Wright-Ward and UConn's Kaitlyn Shain.

Wildcat junior Nicole Hekle was named earlier this week as one of 10 finalists for the Patty Kazmaier Award, recognizing the top player in women's college hockey. She is joined on the list of finalists by PC's Karen Thatcher.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC has achieved a program-high 19 regular-season wins and 16 conference wins ... Sophomore Sarah Feldman recorded two assists in Sunday's game and now leads the Eagles with 18 assists on the season.

Boston University: UNH was the only Hockey East team that swept BU in the Terriers' inaugural season ... Goaltender Karilyn Pilch made 37 saves in just her sixth start of the season on Wednesday vs. UNH.

University of Connecticut: The Huskies narrowly missed their second consecutive playoff berth and third in four seasons. A win at Providence Sunday would have secured them a spot. In the game, UConn was outshot 15-3 in the first period and 19-3 in the third, but dominated the second period with a 22-9 shot advantage.

University of Maine: When the Black Bears score first, they are 12-3-4, and when they lead after one period of play, they are 10-1-1 ... 17 wins this season is a new Maine record ... The Black Bears tallied four power play goals on the weekend and have 44 in 31 games played this season ... Kelly Law and Julie Poulin each share the new Maine record of 25 points in a single season by a defenseman.

University of New Hampshire: Brian McCloskey recorded his 100th career victory with UNH's 5-0 win vs. Vermont Friday ... UNH has shut out four consecutive opponents and takes a shutout streak of 282:19 into the postseason ... UNH won all 16 home games this season and has a 23-game unbeaten streak at the Whittemore Center ... The UNH defense has allowed only 1.09 goals per game this season. The school record of 1.20 has stood since the 1987 season ... The Wildcats have 20 goals in their last 54 power play opportunities while their penalty kill has 33 straight successful kills ... Rookie Sam Faber carries a 14-game point streak into the postseason, while rookie defenseman Kacey Bellamy ended the regular season with a point in eight straight. Sophomores Jennifer Hitchcock and Sadie Wright-Ward have five consecutive multiple-point games.

Northeastern University: Nikki Petrich ended the season on a four-game point streak ... The Huskies notched back-to-back shutouts for the first time since Chanda Gunn did it in the 2002 ECAC Tournament ... Laura Schuler recently enjoyed her first three-game win streak as head coach at NU ... The Huskies had a streak of 23 successful penalty kills end Sunday vs. Niagara.

Providence College: The Friars are 5-0 when scoring five goals, and have tallied a five-goal game in each month this season ... Freshman Erin Normore scored her first career game-winning goal in the 5-2 win over UConn Sunday. Normore leads all Friar freshmen with 21 points ... Providence limited UConn to just three shots in both the first and third periods Sunday, but surrendered 22 shots to the Huskies in the second period.

University of Vermont: This season is the first since 1999-00 that more than two goaltenders have seen action in net for Vermont, and each of the three this year played in at least 11 games ... 25 of Vermont's 30 goals on the season came at home. The Catamounts were shut out 14 times this year and only managed more than one goal in six contests ... With 58 penalty minutes this season, Kate Lesniak has established a new UVM record.

COMING UP ...

The fourth annual women's Hockey East championship is on tap for next weekend at Northeastern's Matthews Arena, and it promises to be one of the best ever.

With a 30-2-1 record, top-ranked UNH enters the tourney as the No. 1 seed, but its only tie came against first-round opponent Maine, while one of its two losses came against No. 2 seed Boston College. The only one of the four teams in the tourney field that failed to get at least a tie against each of the others is Providence, which was swept by UNH. But the Friars are the three-time defending champs, and until someone else wins it, the title is still theirs. And although UNH has now won or shared three consecutive regular season titles, the Wildcats have not won a league tournament championship since 1996.

BC is looking forward to a semifinal rematch with Providence, considering a 9-1 result in favor of the Friars in the first round of the 2005 tournament. The Friars won the first meeting this year, but BC came back with back-to-back victories in a home-and-home set just 10 days ago.

Maine, meanwhile, has provided UNH's only minor blemish in the last 26 games, a 5-5 tie on Jan. 13. The Wildcats gave up only five goals total over nine games in February.
