### UNH GAINS REDEMPTION; UCONN SWEEPS UVM BU takes a pair from Robert Morris; Black Bears get first win

The return engagement against Minnesota was indeed sweet for New Hampshire as the Wildcats knocked off the Golden Gophers, in overtime, to capture the Easton Shootout in Minneapolis on Saturday.

The 6-5 win, on a strike by junior captain Martine Garland (Toronto ON), helped UNH avenge a 5-4 loss in last year's NCAA semifinals, and gave the Wildcats a weekend sweep after they steamrolled Bemidji State, 7-0, on Friday. UNH sophomore Samantha Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) propelled the Wildcats, registering six points on the weekend (three goals, three assists), including a pair of goals against Minnesota. Another of New Hampshire's super sophomores, defenseman Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA), scored twice in the win against Bemidji State.

Hockey East's second team in the Easton Shootout – the Maine Black Bears – rebounded from a tough, 5-2 loss to Minnesota to tip Bemidji State, 3-2, on Saturday, giving Interim Coach Lauren Steblen her first win at the helm of the Maine program.

In the Hockey East opener on Friday at the Freitas Ice Froom in Storrs, CT, UConn junior Jaclyn Hawkins (Manotick, ON) posted a hat trick as the Huskies ran roughshod over Vermont, 8-2. The next night, the Catamounts battled the Huskies through a scoreless first period, but eventually fell, 3-0, giving UConn the weekend sweep. Hawkins was again the difference, potting another two goals in the rematch.

At Boston College on Saturday, the Eagles recorded an impressive 6-0 win against the Quinnipiac Bobcats, with sophomore Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS) registering the hat trick and freshman Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) stopping 23 shots for the shutout.

In other non-league matches, Boston University swept a pair of hard-fought games from Robert Morris in Pittsburgh. The Terriers took Friday's game 4-1, and then won the Saturday rematch by a 3-2 margin. Northeastern didn't fare as well, as the Huntington Hounds ran into a buzz saw at Ohio State and dropped a pair to the Buckeyes, 9-3 and 7-1, in Columbus, OH.
