TERRIERS, WILDCATS, EAGLES STILL UNDEFEATED Providence splits as UConn nips Friars; NU gets first win

It's currently a dogfight atop the Hockey East standings, as the Terriers of Boston University and the Huskies of Connecticut both laid claim to the top spot with strong showings this past week. The Terriers made the best of their home-ice advantage by taking two from the Vermont Catamounts, who were visiting Boston for the first time this season. Sophomore Allyse Wilcox and freshman Melissa Haber each registered shut-outs for BU, as the Catamounts were unable to solve the Terriers' defense in 3-0 and 4-0 losses.

Not to be outdone, the Huskies toppled the Maine Black Bears, 8-3, behind a five-point effort from league leading scorer Jaclyn Hawkins (Manotick, ON) and the consistently solid goaltending of Brittany Wilson (Nepean, ON). The UConn goalie was even better on Saturday, as she out-dueled Providence's Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF) in a 1-0 win for the Huskies on the Friars' home ice. Husky freshman forward Michelle Binning (Oshawa, ON) got the lone goal, the first of her career at UConn, preserving the team's perfect league mark (4-0-0).

That loss ended a sterling run by Coach Bob Deraney's Friars, who registered back-to-back wins against Northeastern on Wednesday and Friday, by near identical 4-1 and 5-1 margins. The Huntington Hounds rebounded nicely, as they came roaring back from a four-goal deficit to nip the Maine Black Bears, 6-5, on Sunday. Colleen Sanborn (Woburn, MA) capped the program's biggest comeback in 20 years when she potted the game-winner for Northeastern.

In non-league action, Boston College took three of a possible four points from two Ivy opponents, tying up Princeton, 2-2, on Friday, and then putting the clamps on Yale, 3-1, on Saturday. Freshman sensation Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) was again superb for the Eagles in goal, stopping 58 of 61 shots on the weekend.

The UNH Wildcats also went toe-to-toe with an old Ivy opponent, and true to form, beat Brown in Durham, 2-0. Senior goalie Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC) notched her 24th career shutout, and now stands only two behind current record holder, former All-American Jen Huggon. UNH finished the weekend with a 4-1 win at Colgate, leaving the 'Cats a perfect 7-0-0 on the season, but with only a single victory in Hockey East, setting up two intriguing showdowns against Boston College and Boston University next weekend.

F; Woburn, MA) - Got the game-winner to cap a furious comback against Maine. Also had an assist in the 6-5 win. Kelly Paton, UNH (Fr. F; Woodstock, ON) - Recorded four points, all on assists, to help UNH defeat ECAC foes Brown and Colgate last weekend. TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Friday's 2-2 tie with Princeton is the second time in as many meetings that the two teams have come to the same result ... Last year's top scorer, junior co-captain Deb Spillane, scored her first goal of the season in her first game back from injury on Friday ... Freshman goalie Molly Schaus doubled her season save total in two games. Coming into the weekend, Schaus had 55 saves, but made 58 this weekend to bring that total to 113.

Boston University: Saturday and Sunday's back-to-back shutouts marked a program first for Boston University. Last year during their inaugural year, the team recorded only a single shutout (a 3-0 win over UConn last January) ... Melissa Anderson has recorded a point in every game she's played (5 games, 10 points), including three multiple-point games ... Boston University's 6-0-0 start sets a program high.

University of Connecticut: UConn converted on six of its 10 power play tries on Saturday. The previous NCAA benchmark was five power play goals, a feat done thrice and most recently by Ohio State against Minnesota State-Mankato on Oct. 11, 2002. Records date back to 2001 when the NCAA first began to administrate women's hockey ... At 4-1, it is by far the fastest start in school history for the Huskies. UConn had never before won its fourth game prior to Nov. 10 (2003 vs. Quinnipiac).

University of Maine: Sophomore Vanessa Vani (St. Catherines, Ontario) tallied four goals this weekend for the Black Bears, including a hat trick against Northeastern on Sunday. Sophomore Robyn Law (Markham, Ontario) registered four points this weekend with a goal and three assists, and her sister, Kelly Law, collected three points with a goal and two assists ... Brigitte Laflamme (St.-Augustin, Quebec) notched two goals for the Black Bears this weekend.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has won 21 consecutive regular-season games and has a 33 game regular-season unbeaten streak of 32-0-1 ... UNH has won 19 consecutive home games and is unbeaten in the last 25 game at the Whittemore Center (22-0-3) ... With one assist in both of last weekend's games, Sadie Wright-Ward (Durham, N.H.) has at least one assist in every game this season ... Sam Faber (Mt. Sinai, N.Y.) scored a goal in five consecutive games with her game-winning goal vs. Brown.

Northeastern University: Six different players got their first goals of the season in the 6-5 come-from-behind win over Maine on Sunday afternoon ... Freshman Katy Applin recorded her first career goal and sophomores Colleen Sanborn and Cassie Sperry scored their second collegiate goals ... NU's 43 shots marked the first time the team topped the 40-shot mark since Jan. 30, 2004 against Providence.

Providence College: Sarah Feldman, a leading scorer for the Boston College Eagles last year, obviously doesn't mind the change of scenery in Rhode Island. After her three point (a goal, two assists) effort against Northeastern on Sunday, Feldman has a total of seven points on the young season.

University of Vermont: After its first six games on the road, Vermont hosts Sacred Heart on Friday in its home opener to open a nine-game homestand to Gutterson Fieldhouse ... The Catamounts also take on the Pioneers Saturday afternoon.
