UNH FLEXES ITS MUSCLE WITH TWO BIG LEAGUE WINS UConn and UVM each sweep a pair; Providence battles but loses

And then there were two. Connecticut and New Hampshire remain at the top of the Hockey East standings with perfect league marks after a weekend of inter-league skirmishes knocked Boston College and Boston University from the unbeaten ranks.

Boston College took UNH to the brink on Friday night before falling, 2-1, to the top-ranked Wildcats. With less than six minutes to go in Durham, and the Eagles clinging to a 1-0 lead, UNH's Jennifer Hitchcock (Lasalle, ON) buried a power play goal to tie the game. Hitchcock also got the game-winner, only 3:30 later, to complete the come-from-behind victory and preserve UNH's gleaming 8-0-0 mark.

On Sunday, the Wildcats made it nine wins in a row when they beat the visiting Terriers, 4-0, behind two goals from junior Leah Craig (Seaforth, ON) and the shutout goaltending of Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC). BU came into the game with an unblemished 6-0-0 mark, but couldn't solve the Wildcat D. The Eagles quickly regrouped, and pinned a 7-4 loss on Northeastern, despite the heroics of Husky goaltender Sydney Arbelbide (Littleton, CO), who finished with 41 saves. BC netminder Johanna Ellison (Cloquet, MN) registered her first win of the season.

If winning the close ones is key to winning championships, UConn is looking good. In non-conference action, Huskies took a pair of thrillers from Wayne State, 4-3 and 3-2, to finish the week at 7-1-0 overall. Junior Jaclyn Hawkins (Manotick, ON) continued her torrid early season pace, as she potted two goals and four assists over the two-game series, while freshman sensation freshman Dominique Thibault (L'Original, ON) scored three goals and had an assist.

Vermont also had a reason to celebrate, after posting the programs first two wins of the season by sweeping Sacred Heart, 6-2 and 3-2. Freshman Chelsea Furlani (Colchester, VT) paced the Catamounts with four points (two goals, two assists) along with Jackie Thode's (Aurora, CO) two goals to present first-year coach Tim Bothwell with his first victories.

Despite the best efforts of Providence goaltenders Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, MN) and Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF), the Friars dropped a pair to 3rd-ranked Mercyhurst in Pennsylvania, 4-3 and 3-0. Ciarletta registered a career-high 45 saves in Saturday's loss, while Bugden stopped 31 of 34 Laker shots on Sunday.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC extended its win streak vs. NU to five games after Sunday's win ... Senior Michelle Lombardi (Milton, MA) played her 100th career game vs. UNH, and scored her first goal of the season vs. NU ... Freshman Anna McDonald scored her team-leading 6th goal, and is tied with sophomore Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS) with 9 points.

Boston University: Allyse Wilcox (Grand Blanc, MI) allowed more than two goals for the first time this season, giving up four goals against New Hampshire. Wilcox made a season-high 35 saves ... The loss to UNH ends BU's six-game winning streak, a program high. Last season the Terriers longest winning streak was two games ... BU faces BC on Saturday, Nov. 4 for the first of three meetings this season. BC leads the overall series 0-2-1.

University of Connecticut: UConn is off to its best start in program history with a 7-1-0 record ... The Huskies are outscoring their opponents by a 30-14 margin ... Only eight games into the season, Jaclyn Hawkins is well on her way to smashing her point total from a year ago, in which she had 27. To date, she has 19 points.

University of Maine: The Black Bears, which had the weekend off, prepare to welcome the Fighting Sioux of North Dakota to Orono next weekend. The women hope to repeat the success of the men's program, which swept the Fighting Sioux earlier this year.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has won 23 consecutive regular-season games and has a 35 game regular-season unbeaten streak of 34-0-1 ... UNH has won 21 consecutive home games and is unbeaten in the last 27 game at the Whittemore Center (24-0-3) ... Nineteen of UNH's 38 goals have come on the power play ... UNH recorded double digits in shots all six periods last weekend while yielding no more than nine shots in a period.

Northeastern University: Freshman goaltender Sydney Arbelbide faced 48 shots on Sunday, the most faced by an NU goaltender since Boston University peppered Marisa Hourihan with 50 on Feb. 14, 2006. Her save total was the most by a Husky since Hourihan's 47 in that game ... Northeastern's 2-0 lead after one period on Sunday marked the first time all season that the Huskies have led after one period ... After Sunday's game, the Huskies will play six consecutive games on the road.

Providence College: After two tough losses to national power Mercyhurst, Providence Coach Bob Deraney will have plenty of time to tinker with his offense before the Friars play Yale on Nov. 8.

University of Vermont: Vermont won its first two games of the season sweeping Sacred Heart at Gutterson Fieldhouse ... The Catamounts had scored only three times in six games prior to Friday's home opener, then scored three goals in a nine-minute span in the first period ... Five of Vermont's nine goals came from rookies.
