UNH TAKES THREE POINTS FROM ST. LAWRENCE UConn, BU score league wins; PC, Maine, NU fit to be tied

The New Hampshire Wildcats returned to action with a chip on their shoulder. UNH dropped a spot in the national polls following its first loss of the season last week, but Coach Brian McCloskey's 'Cats showed no ill effects. His squad garnered three out of four points from fourth-ranked St. Lawrence while preserving its 29-game home unbeaten streak (26-0-3). Freshman Kelly Paton (Woodstock, ON) scored the lone UNH goal in Saturday's 1-1 tie and generated all of the offense that goalie Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC) would need as she added two tallies in Sunday's 4-0 victory. Bourdon tied Jen Huggon in the UNH record books with her 26th career shutout.

After dropping two games at Ohio State, Connecticut was determined to right the ship with two league games against Boston University and Northeastern. The Huskies did just that with a 2-0 shutout at BU on Saturday on the strength of Brittany Wilson's (Nepean, ON) 24-save performance and returned to Storrs to defeat Northeastern in overtime thanks to Leslie Hurlbut's (Markham, ON) late-game heroics. The senior left-winger knotted the game at two with under six minutes remaining and then finished the job in OT, potting the game-winner just seven seconds into the extra session. The game marked Northeastern's second overtime tilt in as many days as they tied Vermont, 3-3 on Saturday. Chelsey Jones (Lake Elmo, MN) added a goal in each of the Huskies' games to extend her point streak to seven games (5-5-10).

The Catamounts picked up their first Hockey East point of the season with the tie at Northeastern before heading home to take on BU. Terrier freshman Melissa Haber (Toronto, ON) stole the show, making 17 saves for her second career shutout. Coach Tim Bothwell's UVM squad mounted considerable pressure, but could not overcome Erin Seman's (Ramsey, MN) second-period strike.

Providence had a long week with the first of three tilts beginning on Wednesday at Yale. Only Kristen Gigliotti (Sauqoit, NY) was able to solve the Bulldogs defense, netting two goals, as PC fell 3-2. On Saturday, the Friars were back on the road to Orono to face the Black Bears. The two teams treated the fans to free hockey on both occasions with each match-up reaching overtime before ending in a 1-1 tie. Again it was Gigliotti leading the Friars as she got the lone goal in each game, giving her nine on the season. Maine netminder Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, QC) backstopped the Black Bears with 46 saves to earn the game's First Star accolades.

Boston College only had one game this week, a 3-2 victory over the Brown Bears on Thursday, as junior Deborah Spillane (Franklin, MA) broke a 2-2 tie 36 seconds into the final stanza.

Junior Deb Spillane (Franklin, MA), who led the Eagles last year with four game-winning goals, scored her first gamewinner against Brown in her fourth game this season ... With a goal and an assist vs. Brown, freshman Megan Keever (Harrisburg, PA) has now registered multiple points in each of her last four games.

Boston University: BU faces Providence at home on Saturday, Nov. 18. Providence leads the all-time series 2-0-1 ... Freshman goaltender Melissa Haber (Toronto, ON) has now recorded shutouts in both of her collegiate starts, registering the 4-0 shutout on Oct. 22 and the 3-0 shutout on Nov. 12, both against Vermont.

University of Connecticut: Goaltender Brittany Wilson shutout BU on Saturday, making 24 saves, and then made 23 stops in a 3-2 OT win over NU on Sunday, allowing just two power play goals. Katherine Van Deveire (Brandon, MB) registered her first goal of the year on Saturday against Boston University.

University of Maine: The Black Bears (3-7-2, 0-4-2) notched their first two Hockey East points this weekend with two key ties against Providence. Previously, Maine's Hockey East record against PC stood at 1-20-4 ... On Sunday, with Maine down 1-0 late in the second period, Kelly Law's (Sr. D; Markham, ON) point blast was deflected in by Sonia Corriveau (Sr. F; Rouyn-Noranda, QC) for a power play marker to knot the game, 1-1, and goalie Genevieve Turgeon barred the door the rest of the way.

University of New Hampshire: With the tie and win vs. St. Lawrence, UNH extended its unbeaten streak at the Whittemore Center to 29 games (26-0-3) ... One day after playing in the gold-medal game at the Four Nations Cup in Kitchener, Ontario, Kacey Bellamy returned to the UNH lineup Sunday and matched her career highs in both assists and points with three assists vs. St. Lawrence ... UNH's eight Canadians have combined to score 23 of the team's 45 goals ... UNH has a 3-1-1 record vs. nationally-ranked teams this season.
