# BC ENDS CONNECTICUT'S PERFECT LEAGUE START UNH, PC notch league wins; UConn-BU tie; UVM falls to Robert Morris

Boston College made a statement Saturday in defeating UConn. The Eagles doubled up the Huskies in shots and got a 5-1 win, ruining Connecticut's 6-0-0 league record.

BC's Megan Fardelmann (Lansing, KA) returned to action after missing two games with a shoulder injury and quickly paid dividends, giving her squad an early 1-0 lead. Connecticut's Amy Hollstein (Pembroke, MA) squared things up late in the first period and the Huskies seemed primed to take over, outshooting the Eagles in the first stanza. A late UConn penalty, however, gave Boston College momentum and defenseman Maggie Taverna (Howell, NJ) put the Eagles ahead for good with a power play goal 54 seconds into the second period. Taverna added two assists and Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) made 14 saves to give BC its fifth straight triumph.

On Sunday, UConn again battled to protect home ice and tied Boston University, 2-2. Freshman Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, QC) knotted the game midway through the third period to help the Huskies escape with a point in the standings. That game marked Terrier goalie Melissa Haber's (Toronto, ON) third consecutive start. After shutting out Vermont last week, Haber suffered a 5-3 defeat at the hands of Providence on Saturday. The Friars spotted BU a 2-0 lead before Kristin Gigliotti (Sauquoit, NY) buried the first of four unanswered goals from Providence. PC got muchneeded offense from veterans Sarah Feldman (Fall River, MA) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, NM), as each garnered multi-point games. On Sunday, the Friars returned home, but could not finish off Robert Morris, tying 1-1 despite a 45-15 shot advantage.

Coach Brian McCloskey's New Hampshire squad nailed down four league points with impressive twin wins against visiting Northeastern. Eight players had multiple point games and captain Nicole Hekle (Winnipeg, MB) provided the game-winner in Friday's 7-2 victory. Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC) started her 100<sup>th</sup> career game and improved her record to 9-1-1 on the season. In Saturday's rematch, UNH's Jennifer Hitchcock (LaSalle, ON) and Angela Taylor (Paisley, Scotland) notched two tallies each to ensure the 5-1 win. Kelly Paton (Woodstock, ON) got the 'Cats on the board with a shorthanded tally to extend her goal scoring streak to four games. Sam Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) helped the cause with three assists, totaling five helpers on the weekend. NU's Nikki Petrich (Flint, MI) picked up two goals on the weekend in a losing effort.

Vermont was shutout by Robert Morris in its lone battle, 2-0. The Catamounts outshot RMU, 21-16, but failed to convert on two third period power plays.

## **TEAM NOTES**

**Boston College:** The Eagles have now won the last five meetings against the UConn Huskies and the last three in Storrs ... BC's current five-game win streak is the longest this season ... Meghan Fardelmann returned to the ice after separating a shoulder against UNH on Nov. 2, and scored the Eagles' first goal against UConn.

**Boston University:** Sunday's 2-2 tie against Connecticut was the first tie for BU this season ... Freshman Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) is leading the team with 13 points. Through 10 games she averaging an assist per game ... The women travel to Schenectady, N.Y. to face Union College in a two-game series on Nov. 25-26. Last season, BU picked up its first win in program history against Union (4-1) on Oct. 14 at home.

**University of Connecticut:** The Huskies have this weekend off for Thanksgiving and will return to action the following Saturday at Boston College. UConn will then play host to Harvard on Tuesday, Dec. 5 ... UConn's tie against BU on Sunday was its first of the year ... Senior defenseman Natalie Vibert (Thunder Bay, ON) scored her fifth goal of the year on Sunday, topping her 2005-06 season total of four.
