PROVIDENCE NETS LEAGUE WINS OVER BU, BC UConn holds league lead; Maine and NU split; UNH blanks UVM

Perennial power Providence College scored two league victories this weekend and announced to the rest of Hockey East that the Friars are back. After struggling through a tepid start in which PC won just four of its first 13 games, Coach Bob Deraney's squad has reeled off three consecutive wins and leapfrogged Boston College in the divisional standings.

The Friars opened the weekend with a 4-2 win over Boston University thanks to a four-goal second period and solid goaltending from Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, MN). BU saw its three-game winning streak snapped after the Terriers had defeated Quinnipiac, 3-2, on Wednesday. Jenna Kielch (Clinton Township, MI) was the offensive star for PC, picking up three points while senior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, NM) tallied the game-winner.

Sunday's game yielded the same result: another Boston school, another Friar victory, as Providence handed Boston College its second loss in as many games in a 3-2 thriller at Schneider Arena. Katy Beach (Cleveland, OH) put the Friars ahead for good with just over 12 minutes remaining and goalie Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF) made 22 stops to earn the victory.

BC's weekend began with a 4-2 home loss to first-place Connecticut. UConn's Brittany Wilson (Nepean, ON) was superb between the pipes, stonewalling the Eagles and making 37 saves to earn her tenth victory of the season. The Huskies had BC on its heels with two quick goals from Liza Gallinaro (Amherst, MA) and Amy Hollstein (Pembroke, MA) before Leslie Hurlburt (Markham, ON) netted the eventual game-winner to give UConn a 3-0 lead at after a period. BC's Becky Zavisza was the lone bright spot for the Eagles this weekend, picking up three points.

The Northeastern-Maine doubleheader promised lots of scoring after NU's dramatic 6-5 win over the Black Bears earlier in the season and the action did not disappoint. Coming off of a 23-goal performance last weekend, the Bears continue to find the back of the net, scoring a 7-2 win over the Huskies on Saturday on the strength of captain Sonia Corriveau's (Rouyn-Noranda, QC) three strikes. The Huntington Hounds rebounded on Sunday, notching a 6-2 victory in Orono. Freshman Chelsey Jones (Lake Elmo, MN) answered Corriveau's hat trick with three goals of her own and added two assists, snapping Maine's seven game unbeaten streak.

In Durham, third-ranked UNH whitewashed Vermont, 5-0. Sophomores Sam Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) and Angela Taylor (Paisley, Scotland) each contributed three points as the Wildcats peppered Catamount goaltender Jenilee Roy (Sandown, NH) with a season-high 54 shots.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles fell to UConn for the first time in six meetings on Saturday ... With the 3-2 loss to the Friars on Sunday, Boston College suffered its first back-to-back losses of the season ... After averaging 5.4 goals per game during its five game winning streak, the Eagles have averaged 2.25 goals per game in the past four games and scored two or fewer goals three times.

Boston University: The starting line of Erin Seman (Ramsey, MN), Melissa Anderson and co-captain Cara Hendry (Calgary, AB) have contributed 11 of BU's 16 points in its last two outings ... The Terriers return home on Tuesday, Dec. 5, to face Brown ... Head coach Brian Durocher increased his career winning percentage to .500. Durocher is 22-22-5 overall ... With the Quinnipiac win, BU hiked its non-league record to 8-0-0.

University of Connecticut: UConn upended No. 9 Boston College on Saturday for its first ranked win of the year. The Huskies have a shot at a second on Tuesday when they play host to No. 5 Harvard ... The BC win was UConn's 10th of the year overall. The Huskies had never previously hit the double-digit mark in victories prior to Jan. 16 (2001-02 season).

University of Maine: Maine got their first Hockey East win on the season with a 7-2 win against NU on Saturday ... Sunday brought a dreaded sense of deja vu for the Black Bears. Much like the October match-up, Northeastern scored five unanswered goals to lift the Huskies to a 6-2 win, putting a halt to Maine's seven game unbeaten streak.

University of New Hampshire: UNH went 5-1-1 on its eight-game homestand and outscored the opposition 30-7 ... Rookie goaltender Lucy Schoedel (Ithaca, NY) has two shutouts in three starts ... The Wildcats are on the verge of becoming the first U.S. women's college hockey program to reach 600 victories. UNH has an overall record of 597-155-49 for a .776 winning percentage.

Northeastern University: Chelsey Jones notched NU's first hat trick since Amy Goodney (Marguette, MI) on Nov. 14. 2004 and the Huskies' first five-point game since Brooke Whitney on Jan. 27, 2002 ... NU scored five unanswered goals in the second period, marking the second time this season the Huskies had scored five straight on the Black Bears (Oct. 22).

Providence College: The Friars now have two wins over BU this season, both times coming back from a 2-0 deficit to win ... The Friars went 260 minutes and 13 seconds without allowing a power play goal before BU tallied one in the second period of Saturday's game.

University of Vermont: Vermont lost its lone game of the week at third-ranked New Hampshire on Saturday, despite the efforts of junior goalie Jenilee Roy (49 saves) ... Vermont takes a break for exams and does not return to action until a two-game series at Minnesota State Mankato on Dec. 30-31.
