CONNECTICUT TOPPLES HARVARD UNH battles lvy powers to a pair of stalemates; Eagles rebound

Both league and non-league action provided intriguing storylines this week. In Hockey East, Boston College rebounded from two losses to beat Northeastern, forcing a three-way tie with New Hampshire and Providence for second place behind Connecticut. The Huskies also went into the holiday break on a high note, edging perennial power Harvard, 3-2, last Tuesday on the strength of Brittany Wilson's (Nepean, ON) goaltending and Kristen Russell's (Dauphin, MB) late game-winner.

Meanwhile, third-ranked New Hampshire battled two of the top teams in the country to a pair of 3-3 draws over the weekend. Fifthranked Harvard, with superstar Julie Chu, promptly built a 3-1 lead on the Wildcats through two periods. But UNH's Jennifer Hitchcock (LaSalle, ON) stunned the Crimson faithful with two third-period tallies to square the match. On Sunday, the Wildcats hosted intrastate rival Dartmouth, and again deadlocked. UNH fought back from an early 2-0 deficit and Hitchcock gave the 'Cats a 3-2 lead, only to see the Big Green get the tying goal in the last 19 seconds.

Boston College scorched the Northeastern with five unanswered goals in the second stanza to cruise to the 7-1 victory. Eagle forward Becky Zavisza (Suffield, CT) and NU's Nikki Petrich (Flint, MI) traded tallies in the first before the Eagles took control. BC's Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS) scored the first of her two strikes to give the Eagles the lead for good. Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH) continued her impressive play with two points.

The rest of the conference was engaged in non-league play, and Boston University picked up Hockey East's lone victory, whitewashing Sacred Heart, 8-0. Two first period goals from Erin Seman (Ramsey, MN) were all Melissa Haber (Toronto, ON) would need as she recorded her third career shutout in only her sixth start. Freshman Lynn Hillen (Minnetonka, MN) scored the first three points of her career while sophomore Caroline Bourdeau (West Hartford, CT) contributed a goal and three helpers.

The tales of Providence and Maine were eerily similar as each team got brilliant goaltending but failed to find much offense, dropping twin tilts each to ECACHL foes. The Friars lost, 5-0, at Dartmouth despite 36 saves from Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF). On Saturday, the Friars fell to Harvard, 2-0, with Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, MN) absorbing the loss despite a fine effort in goal. In Orono, the Maine Black Bears hosted St. Lawrence for a pair but came away empty-handed both times, falling by the identical 5-1 score on back-to-back occasions.

Boston College: With an 11-4-1 first-half, this is the best start the Eagles have ever had ... Saturday was the most balanced attack for BC this year as six different Eagles notched goals ... The five-goal second period for the Eagles on Saturday is a season-high ... Sophomore goaltender Johanna Ellison (Cloquet, MN) made her second appearance of the season on Saturday, replacing Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) in the third period.

Boston University: Halfway through the 2006-07 season, sophomore Erin Seman (Ramsey, MN) has compiled nine goals and nine assists. Seman's 18 total points at the midway point of the season equals her 2005-06 season totals (7-11-18) ... The starting forward line of Erin Seman, senior co-captain Cara Hendry (Calgary, AB) and freshman Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) is responsible for 28 of BU's last 57 points.
