UNH, BC SWEEP INTO FIRST PLACE Connecticut shocks Dartmouth; Terriers take two

There is a new leader atop the Hockey East standings. Two, actually. New Hampshire and Boston College each pulled off weekend sweeps to leapfrog Connecticut into the top spot. The Wildcats picked up 7-0 and 3-1 victories over visiting Maine to reach first-place while BC whitewashed Vermont 7-0 and 5-0 on consecutive games.

UNH received balanced scoring as Sam Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) led the way with four assists. The Eagles, on the other hand, benefited from outstanding performances by Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS), who racked up nine points in three games, and freshman Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), who put together an eight point week of her own. In the goaltending department, New Hampshire netminder Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC) pinned down her schoolrecord 27th shutout on Friday before deferring to Lucy Schoedel (Ithaca, NY), who earned the 600th victory in the program's history on Saturday. BC Coach Tom Mutch gave workhorse Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) the weekend off and watched Johanna Ellison (Cloquet, MN) deliver his 50th (and 51st) career victories as Ellison picked up backto-back shutouts in Burlington, making 31 saves.

Not to be outdone by the league leaders, Boston University pulled off a sweep of their own. The Terriers stunned Connecticut in Storrs on Thursday, netting a 3-2 overtime victory. BU scored twice

in the third to erase a 2-0 deficit before co-captain Gina Kearns (Norwood, PA) made the bus trip home seem a bit shorter, ending things at 2:13 of the extra session with her second game-winner of the year. Coach Brian Durocher's squad continued their winning ways on Saturday, picking up a spirited 4-2 victory over Northeastern at Walter Brown Arena. It was the Huskies who nearly spoiled a 2-0 Terrier lead before Cara Hendry (Calgary, AB) put the game out of reach in the third period. Freshman Melissa Haber (Toronto, ON) did the rest, stymieing a late NU flurry and making 25 stops to preserve the win. The triumph moved BU within three points of Providence, which was idle in league play, for the final playoff spot.

UConn bounced back from the overtime defeat to snap its losing streak at the hands of an unlikely foe. Fourth-ranked Dartmouth made the trip to Connecticut riding an eleven-game unbeaten streak and sitting atop the ECACHL standings only to be denied by the Huskies, 4-2. UConn needed only five shots in the second period to record three goals and break the game open. Freshman Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, ON) tallied twice, including the game-winner, as the Huskies earned the highest-ranked win in school history.

In Wisconsin, the Providence Friars struggled to find the twine against the Badgers' top-ranked defense, falling 3-0 and 5-0. -Scott Donnelly

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Boston College went 3-0 this week, extending its win streak to four games, and moving into a tie for first place in the league standings with UNH ... Meghan Fardelmann and Kelli Stack combined for 17 points in three games, each registering at least a point in each game ... The Eagles converted seven of 14 power play opportunities this week, going .500 with the extra skater ... BC has scored their season-high seven goals four times, each time against a Hockey East opponent.

Boston University: The Terriers special teams have been on a hot streak in the new year. So far, seven of BU's ten goals have come on the power-play. On the penalty kill, the Terriers have not allowed opponents to score on the power play since Dec. 5, and have killed off 30 straight penalties ... BU's 3-2 overtime win against Connecticut on Thursday was the first ever Hockey East overtime win for the Terriers. Previously, BU beat RPI 3-2 in overtime on Oct. 13, 2006, to earn its first overtime win out of conference ... Senior co-captain Cara Henry (Calgary, Alta.) has recorded a point in 11 of her last 12 games.

University of Connecticut: UConn's win over No. 4 Dartmouth on Saturday marked the Huskies' highest-ranked win in school history. UConn is now 3-3 this year against Top 10 teams. The Dartmouth win snapped a five-game losing skid, UConn's longest since January of 2004. It was UConn's first win ever over the Big Green (1-4-1).

University of Maine: Senior Kate Sunstrum (London, ON) played in her 100th career game for Maine on Friday ... Maine's offense, which is averaging 3.20 goals per game, was shutout at New Hampshire on Friday night. The shutout was the second of the season for Maine, and both were against New Hampshire ... The Black Bears will face Vermont coming up on Saturday. Maine has an 8-0-1 all-time record against UVM.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's shutout streak of Maine ended at 247:37 with the Black Bears' third-period tally on Jan. 13. Rookie goaltender Lucy Schoedel's personal shutout streak ended at 111:17 on that goal ... UNH has a 35-10 scoring advantage in the second period with a 313-99 shot advantage in that stanza — an average of 4.5 shots allowed in the second period ... UNH's penalty kill unit was perfect in the two-game series vs. Maine (8-for-8). The Wildcats' had not allowed a power-play goal in consecutive games since Oct. 27 and 29 in games vs. Boston College and Boston University.

Northeastern University: Freshman Chelsey Jones (Lake Elmo, MN) snapped a season-high three-game scoreless streak with a third-period goal. It was the first time this season she had gone more than two consecutive games without a point ... With two goals and three assists in the last two games, Husky underclassmen have accounted for 70.8 percent of NU goals and 62.1 percent of NU points this season. The freshman class alone has accounted for 45.8 percent of goals and 41.4 percent of points this year ... The Huskies will face BU three more times in the final seven games of the regular season, all in February.

Providence College: The Friars return to Hockey East action, where they are unbeaten in their last six games, on Jan. 20 at Northeastern ... The Friars gave up their first man-down goal in over 295 minutes (dating back to December 9, 2006 versus Harvard University) when Wisconsin was able to score on the advantage with 33 seconds left in Saturday's contest.

University of Vermont: Vermont dropped a pair of games to eighth-ranked Boston College to wrap up its four-game homestand. All four contests were against three of the top four teams in Hockey East with the Catamounts going 1-3-0 ... UVM is at Maine Saturday at noon in its lone game this week.
