'SKATING STRIDES' A HUGE SUCCESS UConn, Eagles sweep; UNH moves past Providence

The "Skating Strides Against Breast Cancer" event may have dominated the weekend, but there were still important league games played. Connecticut and Boston College had the most success, winning weekend sweeps, while UNH took three points from Providence to move into sole possession of second place behind the Eagles.

The weekend's stellar play was overshadowed by a larger cause as Women's Hockey East has already raised more than \$17,000 for the fight against breast cancer as more 1000 fans turned out for the festivities. Players throughout the league sold t-shirts in advance and the teams wore custom jerseys during warm-ups to raise awareness for the cause. Several skaters for each team used pink TPS sticks during the game, which were later signed and raffled off. The final tally is still forthcoming as several men's programs will be raffling off signed merchandise from the "Skating Strides" event at upcoming home games.

On the ice, UNH defeated Providence 3-1 on Saturday before the two teams deadlocked, 2-2 on Sunday afternoon. UNH rookie Micaela Long (South Boston, MA) had a breakout series, notching a goal and an assist on Saturday before potting the game-tying goal at the Whittemore Center in the rematch. PC goalie Danielle Ciarletta was immeanse in the rematch, notching 40 saves.

Connecticut took down Northeastern, 4-1, in a

battle between Huskies. Freshman Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, ON) score the game-winning goal with her pink stick and added two assists to earn the game's First Star as UConn rode a threegoal third period to victory. The teams met again in Boston on Sunday with Connecticut's Huskies winning again, 2-0. Brittany Wilson (Nepean, ON) had an assist and made 37 saves to preserve the shutout as NU outshot UConn 37-18. Connecticut, after falling from first to fourth place, moved into a tie with Providence in third place.

Boston College's vaunted goaltending duo of Johanna Ellison (Cloquet, MN)) and Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) once again proved too stingy for the competition. Ellison and the Eagles turned aside Vermont, 4-1 on Saturday with help from Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH) who had two assists. On Sunday afternoon against Maine, Schaus got the start and whitewashed the Black Bears by a 6-0 score. Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, MN) notched her league-leading 20th and 21st goals of the season as the Eagles protected home ice and tightened their grasp on first-place.

Boston University won its only contest of the week, blanking Maine 3-0. The Terriers and Black Bears entered the third stanza scoreless, but BU score three times in the last 10 minutes to ensure the victory. Sarah Russell (Tewksbury, MA) buried the game-winner, her first tally of the season.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles have won three consecutive games ... Boston College outshot opponents 77-25 in two games this weekend ... BC and its opponents went a combined 1-for-19 on the power play ... Kelli Stack is tied for 10th in the BC record books for points in a season with 37. No Eagle has scored more than 37 points in a season since Erin Magee tallied 41 in 1998-99 as a senior ... Stack has scored at least a point in nine-straight games, including six multi-point games ... Junior Lindsay Wright (Calgary, AB) doubled her goal total to four this season by notching one in each game this weekend.

Boston University: The Terriers recorded their fourth shutout on Saturday, by defeating Maine 3-0. BU has shut out opponents five times this season, four in conference matchups ... Sophomore Sarah Russell (Tewksbury, MA) scored her first goal of the season during the game, notching the game-winning tally ... Freshman Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) returned after missing four games with a dislocated shoulder. Anderson recorded an assist on Saturday, and has recorded at least a point in nine of her last 11 games.

University of Connecticut: UConn took both ends of a homeand-home series against Northeastern this weekend, winning 4-1 on Saturday and 2-0 on Sunday. Coupled with a win in November, it marks the second time that UConn has ever swept a Hockey East season series. UConn took all three meetings with Vermont a year ago ... All four of UConn's shutouts this year have come in Hockey East play.

University of Maine: The Black Bears have now lost eight of their last nine games ... Since the holiday break, Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, QC) has started six straight games. In those games, she has averaged 37 saves and made over 30 saves four times ... In losses to BC and BU over the weekend, Maine was shutout in back-to-back games for the first time since November, 2002 ... The Black Bears will host UConn this weekend. The Huskies won the first game of the season, 8-3.

University of New Hampshire: UNH extended its home unbeaten streak vs. PC to 15 games (12-0-3) with Sunday's 2-2 tie ... Lindsey Caleo (Clinton Township, MI) with three goals and four assists, and Leah Craig (Seaforth, ON) with five goals and two assists, have been UNH's top point producers in January with seven points apiece ... UNH is 2-0-4 in six overtime games this season. The school record for most OT games in one season is eight, and the benchmark for ties is six.

Northeastern University: After being outshot 38-19 in Saturday's game against UConn, the Huskies returned to outshoot UConn, 37-18, on Sunday. The 21-shot margin was the second-highest in NU's favor this season. NU outshot Connecticut 16-0 in the third period, the first time this season NU has held an opponent without a shot on goal for an entire period ...
