UNH STAKES ITS CLAIM TO FIRST PLACE

BU keeps hopes alive; Maine sweeps; BC's Schaus sets save mark

New Hampshire solidified its spot atop the Women's Hockey East standings with two convincing wins, while Boston University kept its play-off heart beating with hard-earned victory over Providence.

The Wildcats didn't show any signs of road fatigue as they rode an offensive explosion to a pair of wins, knocking off Northeastern, 9-0, in Boston on Saturday before subduing Providence, 7-0, on the Friars home ice on Sunday. Senior captain Nicole Hecke led the charge, tallying four points with a two-assist game at Northeastern and a two-goal game at Providence. Blueliner Martine Garland was also a force, collecting five points (1 goal, 4 assists) on the weekend, and goaltender Melissa Bourdon recorded the back-to-back road shut-outs, extending her school career records to 29 shutouts and 81 wins.

The UConn Huskies also served notice Saturday that they'll be a force in the playoffs, edging past Boston College, 3-2, on the Eagles' home ice. Freshman Dominique Thibault slipped the game-winner into the BC net only 80 seconds into the final frame, and UConn's superb sophomore goaltender Brittany Wilson made it stand up with 12 third-period saves.

Also on Saturday, the BU Terriers, fighting for their playoff lives, pinned a 3-1 loss on the team directly ahead of them in the standings, Providence.

BU goaltender Allyse Wilcox, who backstopped the Terriers' come-from-behind win over Northeastern in Tuesday's Beanpot opener, was again solid, turning aside 36 of 37 Friar shots for the win. BU's Gina Kearns got the game-winner, and also added the insurance tally with an unassisted empty-net goal.

To the north, the Maine Black Bears swept a pair of games from Vermont in Burlington, 3-1 on Saturday and 4-2 on Sunday. Maine's Genvieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, QC) got both wins, recording 19 saves each game, while senior forward Kate Sunstrom also had a strong weekend, potting two goals in Saturday's win and adding an assist on Sunday for a three-point visit.

In non-league action, BC freshman sensation Molly Schaus wrote her name in the NCAA record books with a 73-save, triple overtime win against 6th-ranked Harvard in the opening round of the Beanpot at Boston College. Schaus broke the record previously set on Jan. 8, 2005, by Stephanie Boulay of Sacred Heart, who registered 70 saves in an 8-0 loss to Maine. BC's 4-3 win over Harvard gave the Eagles a berth in the championship, where they'll meet cross-town rival Boston University on Tuesday night.

Northeastern will play Harvard in the Beanpot consolation game Tuesday, after dropping a 4-2 decision to the Terriers last week.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: UConn remained the only team to defeat the Eagles on their home ice in Conte Forum, doing so for the second time this season on Saturday ... The 4-3 Beanpot semifinal win over Harvard lasted 114:13, the longest game in BC women's hockey history ... BC looks to repeat as the Beanpot Tournament champions this Tuesday night when they take on Boston University in the Beanpot Championship Game at 8:00 p.m. It is the first time since 1981 that BC has faced BU in the final.

Boston University: Tuesday's game in the Beanpot final will be the first time the team as made it since 1982, and the first time ever as varsity program ... In 1982, BU defeated BC, 10-0 in the first round, before falling to Harvard, 2-1 in the championship game ... Sarah Appleton (New Canaan, CT) and Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) both notched two assists during the Beanpot win last Tuesday, setting a team high ... New Hampshire remains the sole Hockey East school that BU has yet to defeat at least once this season. The teams close out their season series on Feb. 21, at Walter Brown Arena.

University of Connecticut: UConn improves to 4-4-1 on the year against ranked teams with the win at BC ... The Huskies wrapped up a season-long five game road stretch with a 4-1-0 record, including a perfect 4-0-0 mark in league play ... UConn is the only team to beat BC at home this season and has now done so twice ... Jaclyn Hawkins (Manotick, ON) has 16 assists on the season, leaving her one shy of the only UConn scoring record that she doesn't hold (single-season assists; 17 by Tiffany Owens in 2004-05).

University of Maine: With two wins over Vermont on the weekend, the Black Bears swept the season series with the Catamounts ... Maine has never lost to Vermont, owning a 11-0-2 record over Vermont ... Maine scored four power play goals in the series (4-9), giving the Black Bears 27 power play goals on the season ... With 25 points on the season, Vanessa Vani (St. Catherine's, ON) has topped her total of 23 points last season. Vani leads Maine in assists and points, and is second on the team in goals ... Maine won back-to-back games for the first time since Nov. 25 and Dec. 2.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's nine-goal outburst at Northeastern marked the team's highest goal total of the season; the Wildcats have scored seven goals five times ... Shannon Clement (Sault Ste Marie, ON) recorded her third career hat trick and matched her personal best of four points at NU ... Courtney Sheary (Melrose, MA) recorded her first career multiple-point game with two assists at NU ... Jackie Wedster (Chicago, IL) matched her career high of three assists at NU ... Twenty-nine of Melissa Bourdon's 81 career victories have been shutouts.

Northeastern University: Amy Goodney (Marquette, MI) had her two-game scoring streak snapped on Saturday against UNH ... Marie Desrosiers (St. Hubert, QC) and Jessica Coppney (South Boston, MA) moved into 15th place on the school's all-time games-played list by playing in their 128th game on Saturday.

Providence College: On Saturday, February 10, Sonny Watrous (Ibuquerque, NM) netted her 10th goal of the season versus BU, making it four straight seasons with 10 or more goals and 27 or more points for the Friars... Providence suffered its second shutout at home this season against UNH on 2/11.

University of Vermont: Sarah Smiddy (Grand Rapids, MI) had a goal and an assist against the Black Bears Sunday ... Chelsea Furlani (Colchester, VT) set up a goal Saturday against Maine and now has 10 points (6-4-10), the most by a Catamount freshman since Vermont joined Division I in 2001-02.
