UNH WRAPS UP REGULAR SEASON CROWN BC takes home Beanpot; Northeastern sweeps; Maine, BU split

As the regular season enters its final week, the playoff picture is becoming clearer. This past weekend New Hampshire locked up a fourth consecutive league title, taking three points from Connecticut. Boston College followed up its Beanpot title with a sweep over Providence and flew past UConn into second place in the standings.

UNH kicked off the weekend with a strong road showing in Storrs, winning a 2-1 decision. Sam Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) scored two goals in the first period for the Wildcats to secure the win. In the rematch on Sunday, UConn forced the 'Cats settled for a 2-2 tie, but it was still enough to clinch the title. UNH had taken a 2-1 lead into the final stanza, but Natalie Vibert (Thunder Bay, ON) tied things up with less than seven minutes left. Connecticut netminder Brittany Wilson (Nepean, ON) made 52 stops, and set the Huskies' all-time mark for saves for a season with 885 in the process.

On Tuesday, BC earned its second consecutive Beanpot with a 6-1 win over Boston University. Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS) notched a hat trick and earned MVP honors while Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) was honored as the top goaltender. Over the weekend, the Eagles took a big step toward earning the second seed in the league semifinals with a pair of dominating 6-2 wins over PC. Freshman Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, ON) led the attack, notching six points while picking up a

shorthanded strike and a game-winner along the way. Not to be outdone, classmate Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH) padded her league-leading totals with eight points to set the Hockey East record for points by a freshman with 33.

Elsewhere, Maine and BU swapped victories in Orono though the Terriers' playoff hopes were dimmed by the loss. Boston University nailed down a 2-1 win in the first game as captain Gina Kearns (Norwood, PA) scored the eventual game-winner. The squads met again on Sunday and the Black Bears gained the upper-hand, erasing a 2-1 deficit in the third period when captain Sonia Corriveau (Rouyn-Noranda, QC) put the Bears ahead for good, 3-2, on Senior Day at Alford Arena. With the Terrier loss, PC moved a step closer toward securing a playoff spot as the Friars can clinch with a win or tie, or a BU loss or tie.

In Boston, Northeastern bounced back from an 8-0 loss to Harvard in the Beanpot consolation game by downing Vermont 4-1 and 2-1 in back-to-back games. NU goalie Sydney Arbelbide (Littleton, CO) earned the first two victories of her career while sophomore Brenna Frost (Liverpool, NY) scored her first career goal, the game-winner, on Sunday. With the goal, Frost became the final Husky skater to score this season. Northeastern is the only team in Hockey East in which every skater has scored at least once.

In other news, New Hampshire's stellar junior captain Martine Garland (Toronto, ON) was named one of the 10 finalists for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, given annually to the outstanding female player in Division 1 hockey. -Scott Donnelly

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC clinched its second-straight playoff berth in the Hockey East Tournament with Sunday's win over PC. The Eagles are guaranteed a third seed or better ... BC recorded four shorthanded goals this week, and have 11 on the season.

Boston University: The series at Maine closed out BU's road slate. The Terriers went 8-6-3 this season on the road, a vast improvement from their rookie season when they went 2-12-2 ... BU's final push ensures that they will finish above .500 on the season for the first time. Their overall records sits at 18-11-3 with two games remaining ... Freshman Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) had a two-point weekend, making her the first Terrier ever to break 28 points. Sophomore Erin Seman (Ramsey, MN) also reached 28 points on Sunday with a goal.

University of Connecticut: In a 3-3 tie with UNH, goalie Brittany Wilson stopped 52 shots, the most ever by a Husky in a Hockey East game. She made 20 saves in both the second and third periods alone and also made 10 saves on UNH's three power plays, all of which were unsuccessful ... Wilson also made 32 saves on Friday night in a 2-1 loss, including 18 in the third period to keep it close as UConn tried to rally for a win.

University of Maine: Maine has won three of its last four games ... Pam Patterson (Miracmichi, NB) scored the Black Bears first shorthanded goal of the season on Sunday against BU ... Rachel Gettings (Watervliet, N.Y.) started her first game since Dec. 9 and stopped 20 of 22 stops for the win ... Kate Sunstrom (London, ON) has a five-game scoring streak going, the second longest streak of the season for a Black Bear ... With 124 games played, Brigitte Laflamme (St. Augustin, QC) has moved into fourth place on the Maine career games played list.

University of New Hampshire: UNH's seniors have won four consecutive Hockey East regular season titles. They have compiled an overall record of 100-23-16, including 55-6-9 at home and 64-6-9 in Hockey East ... UNH's streak of 32 straight successful penalty kills (spanning eight games) ended with UConn's third-period power-play tally on Sunday ... UNH's crowd of 1,209 marked the second time this season that the Wildcats eclipsed 1,000 ... UNH has a 6-3-4 record vs. nationally-ranked teams.

Northeastern University: Sophomore Brenna Frost scored her first collegiate goal in Sunday's win. With her goal, Frost became the 19th and final Husky skater currently on the roster to score a goal this season. The last time every NU skater scored at least once in one season was during the 1998-99 campaign ... With her three-point weekend, Chelsey Jones moved into 23rd place on the school's all-time freshman scoring record with 25 points, moving past current NU head coach Laura Schuler and posting the highest mark by an NU freshman since the 1998-99 season.

Providence College: By scoring two goals this past weekend, junior forward Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, MI) has established a new career-high mark for goals (7) and points (12) ... Sophomore forward Katy Beach established a new career-high mark with 11 points, after registering an assist on Keilch's goal versus BC on Feb. 17... After scoring a power-play goal versus BC on Feb. 17, Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) moved into a first place tie for most power-play goals scored in Hockey East play, as well as a tie with teammate Kristin Gigliotti (Sauguit, NY) for the team lead in goals. Each player now has 14 goals.

University of Vermont: Vermont captain Kristen Norris (Sr., D, Bloomfield Hills, MI) tied the school's record for games played Sunday skating in her 132nd contest. She has not missed a game in her four years ... UVM hosts first place UNH Saturday and Sunday at Gutterson Fieldhouse in its season finale.
