PLAYOFFS SET TO BEGIN

Providence Sweeps UConn to Secure #3 Seed

Semifinals Match UNH vs. UConn and BC vs. PC

New Hampshire's 3-2 win over Boston University on Thursday night assured Providence of the final playoff spot, but there was still much to be decided entering the season's final weekend. PC earned a weekend sweep of Connecticut to vault themselves into third place while New Hampshire fed off of Thursday's win and picked up a pair against Vermont to prep for the postseason stretch.

In Providence on Saturday, the Friars notched a 4-1 victory over the visiting Huskies on the strength of two Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) goals. Goalie Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF) made it quite clear early on that UConn was not going to ruin her Senior Day, putting forth a huge effort to stop the Huskies in their tracks. The teams reconvened in Storrs and the result was the same as PC took home a 6-3 victory thereby earning a semifinal bid against Boston College.

The Eagles grabbed hold of second place thanks to a strong 4-0 win against Maine on Saturday. The league's leading point-getter Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH) notched the eventual game-winner in the first period before Becky Zavisza (Suffield, CT) added two tallies of her own. Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) made 20 stops for her fifth shutout of the season.

The aforementioned Wildcats spent the week on the road, but snuck by BU before dismantling Vermont in Burlington. Sam Faber (Mount Sinai, NY) had five assists on the week, all of them coming in the twin wins at Gutterson Fieldhouse as UNH won 4-0 and 8-1. In Sunday's action, senior goaltender Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC) set a new NCAA record with her 84th career victory. The 'Cats will face off with fourth-seeded Connecticut in the second game of the semifinals.

The only other game of the week featured the fourth and final installment of Northeastern versus Boston University. Again, NU jumped out to a 2-0 lead as they had in the last two battles between the rival schools, but the Terriers stormed back to tie things before the first intermission. Erin Seman (Ramsey, MN) opened the second period with two quick goals and added a third late in the game to complete the first hat trick in history of BU women's varsity hockey.

Elsewhere in the sentimental statistics category, PC's Kristin Gigliotti (Sauquoit, NY) and BC's Deb Spillane (Franklin, MA) picked up their 100th career points in their final game of the regular season. For the senior Gigliotti, the milestone came as part of a four-point effort on Sunday afternoon in the Friars' 6-3 win. Spillane, only a junior, picked

up an assist in the Eagles' 4-0 over the Black Bears, ending an injury-plagued regular season on a high note. — *Scott Donnelly*

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC finishes the regular season with a 23-8-2 overall record and clinched their second consecutive #2 seed in the Hockey East Tournament with a 15-6-0 conference record ... The Eagles went 14-2-2 this season at Conte Forum, going unbeaten against ranked teams at home ... The shutout against Maine was the seventh BC shutout of the season, the most shutouts by any BC squad in program history.

Boston University: BU ended the season above .500 in every category. The Terriers win over Northeastern on Saturday, put the team at 10-9-2 in HE ... Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) ended the season with a team-high 34 points. Last season Laural Koller led the team in points with 28. Other than Anderson, Erin Seman also broke 30 points (31) ... Saturday's win helped head coach Brian Durocher improve his career winning percentage with the team to .515 (31-29-7).

University of Connecticut: UConn is off to its third Hockey East tournament in the league's five-year history. The Huskies have made the tournament every odd year (2003, 2005, 2007). UConn's last appearance was in 2005 when the Huskies upset UNH, 5-4 in overtime, but lost to Providence in the final ... UConn is 1-2 all-time in Hockey East tournament play, also losing to PC in the 2003 semifinals ... UConn's loss to Providence on Sunday snapped a two-game winning streak on "Senior Day."

University of Maine: The Black Bears wrapped up the season with a 4-0 loss at Boston College on Saturday night ... Maine finished the year 10-19-2, the ninth time in 10 seasons with double-digit wins ... Vanessa Vani (St. Catherines, ON) takes the season scoring title for Maine with 26 points on 11 goals and 15 assists ... Goaltender Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, QC) played in 23 games, third most all-time at Maine ... With 124 games played at Maine, Karine Senecel (Montreal, QC) finishes her career fourth on the all-time list.

University of New Hampshire: UNH ended the regular season with an 11-game unbeaten streak (9-0-2) and unbeaten in 17 consecutive Hockey East games (15-0-2) ... UNH has won eight consecutive road games by an aggregate score of 40-6 ... UNH outshot the opposition in 33 of 34 games this season ... UNH's 26 wins ranks No. 4 on the program's list of single-season superlatives ... UNH has a 21-3-3 lifetime record vs. UConn, the Wildcats' semifinal opponent, but a 1-1 record vs. UConn in postseason play (0-1 in Hockey East) ... UNH has a 21-2 home record in postseason play.

Northeastern University: Freshman Chelsey Jones finished the year leading the team in goals (16) and points (27), while Amy Goodney (Marquette, MI) led the team with 12 assists ... Jones' 16 goals are the most by a Husky in a single season since Brooke Whitney led the team with 32 tallies during the 2001-02 season ... NU underclassmen accounted for 69.7 percent of Husky goals and 62.2 percent of points this season.

Providence College: Junior Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, MI) has registered a goal in the last four games for the Friars ... Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Saugoit, NY) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, NM) both have three-game point streaks intact. Over that stretch, Gigliotti has 7 points (3 goals, 4 assists), while Watrous has 4 points (1 goal, 3 assists) ... Gigliotti established a new career-high mark of 21 assists in a season.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts wrapped up their first season under head coach Tim Bothwell with a pair of losses to regular season champion UNH ... Vermont captain Kristen Norris (Bloomfield Hills, MI) set a new school record for games played this weekend, finishing her career with 134. She did not miss a game in her four years.
