UNH REPEATS WITH 3-1 TITLE GAME TRIUMPH OVER FRIARS Providence Can't Match Semifinal Success Over Eagles UNH & BC Advance to NCAA Tournament

The University of New Hampshire employed its depth to full advantage in repelling a stubborn and gritty Providence College squad to defend its WHEA tournament title on Sunday in Durham before a crowd of 1,301. Top seed UNH prevailed by a 3-1 score, never breathing easy until an empty-net goal at 19:34.

UNH had advanced to the final by virtue of a solid 2-0 semifinal win against the #4 University of Connecticut. Just two weeks ago, UNH peppered UConn goalie Brittany Wilson (Nepean, ON) with 54 shots in a 2-2 tie. UConn cut that number almost in half by "limiting" UNH to 28 shots on Saturday. The Wildcats held Connecticut to just nine shots on Melissa Bourdon (Ile Bizard, QC).

#3 Providence reached its fourth WHEA final in five years by way of an inspirational 3-2 win over #2 Boston College. The Eagles took a 2-0 lead early in the second period but saw that evaporate when the Friars scored a pair of power play goals just 21 seconds apart later in the same period. The game-winner came from Jackie Duncan (Hudson, QC) on a breakaway at 1:34 of the third period. Tournament MVP Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, NF) kept BC off the board the rest of the way. On Sunday, UNH never trailed but never felt

comfortable. The Wildcats' Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA) put UNH up 1-0 at 3:46 of the first period. Providence tied the game on a goal by Erin Normore (Cambridge, ON) at 6:42 of the second, only to have UNH come back at 9:48 to re-gain the lead on a Lindsey Caleo (Clinton Township. MI) tally. This would be the game-winner.

When Sam Faber (Mt. Sinai, NY) scored into an empty-net with 0:26 left on the clock, UNH was ready to celebrate. Five different players scored the Wildcats' five goals on the weekend.

The growth of the Women's Hockey East Association was reflected in the record crowd of 2,929 that attended the two-day event. Saturday's semifinal crowd of 1,628 was a single-day tournament record as well.

Further evidence of WHEA progress came when the NCAA announced the pairings for the 7th Annual Women's NCAA Division I Ice Hockey Championships. Hockey East landed two berths in the tournament for the first time. UNH was seeded #4 and will host St. Lawrence. Boston College, not seeded, will travel to #3 Dartmouth. Both games will be played on Saturday. It is the second NCAA appearance for New Hampshire and the first appearance for Boston College.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC finishes the regular season with a 23-8-2 overall record and clinched their second consecutive #2 seed in the Hockey East Tournament with a 15-6-0 conference record ... The Eagles went 14-2-2 this season at Conte Forum, going unbeaten against ranked teams at home ... The shutout against Maine was the seventh BC shutout of the season, the most shutouts by any BC squad in program history.

Boston University: BU ended the season above .500 in every category. The Terriers win over Northeastern on Saturday, put the team at 10-9-2 in HE ... Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC) ended the season with a team-high 34 points. Last season Laural Koller led the team in points with 28. Other than Anderson, Erin Seman also broke 30 points (31) ... Saturday's win helped head coach Brian Durocher improve his career winning percentage with the team to .515 (31-29-7).

University of Connecticut: UConn is off to its third Hockey East tournament in the league's five-year history. The Huskies have made the tournament every odd year (2003, 2005, 2007). UConn's last appearance was in 2005 when the Huskies upset UNH, 5-4 in overtime, but lost to Providence in the final ... UConn is 1-2 all-time in Hockey East tournament play, also losing to PC in the 2003 semifinals ... UConn's loss to Providence on Sunday snapped a two-game winning streak on "Senior Day."

University of Maine: The Black Bears wrapped up the season with a 4-0 loss at Boston College on Saturday night ... Maine finished the year 10-19-2, the ninth time in 10 seasons with double-digit wins ... Vanessa Vani (St. Catherines, ON) takes the season scoring title for Maine with 26 points on 11 goals and 15 assists ... Goaltender Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, QC) playedin 23 games, third most all-time at Maine ... With 124 games played at Maine, Karine Senecel (Montreal, QC) finishes her career fourth on the all-time list.

University of New Hampshire: UNH ended the regular season with an 11-game unbeaten streak (9-0-2) and unbeaten in 17 consecutive Hockey East games (15-0-2) ... UNH has won eight consecutive road games by an aggregate score of 40-6 ... UNH outshot the opposition in 33 of 34 games this season ... UNH's 26 wins ranks No. 4 on the program's list of single-season superlatives ... UNH has a 21-3-3 lifetime record vs. UConn, the Wildcats' semifinal opponent, but a 1-1 record vs. UConn in postseason play (0-1 in Hockey East) ... UNH has a 21-2 home record in postseason play.

Northeastern University: Freshman Chelsey Jones finished the year leading the team in goals (16) and points (27), while Amy Goodney (Marquette, MI) led the team with 12 assists ... Jones' 16 goals are the most by a Husky in a single season since Brooke Whitney led the team with 32 tallies during the 2001-02 season ... NU underclassmen accounted for 69.7 percent of Husky goals and 62.2 percent of points this season.

Providence College: Junior Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, MI) has registered a goal in the last four games for the Friars ... Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, NY) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, NM) both have three-game point streaks intact. Over that stretch, Gigliotti has 7 points (3 goals, 4 assists), while Watrous has 4 points (1 goal, 3 assists) ... Gigliotti established a new career-high mark of 21 assists in a season.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts wrapped up their first season under head coach Tim Bothwell with a pair of losses to regular season champion UNH ... Vermont captain Kristen Norris (Bloomfield Hills, MI) set a new school record for games played this weekend, finishing her career with 134. She did not missed a game in her four years.
