EAGLES FALL IN FROZEN FOUR IN DOUBLE OVERTIME
Molly Schaus ends sparkling rookie season with 47-save performance

Boston College's NCAA run came to a dramatic end as the Eagles dropped a 4-3 decision to Minnesota-Duluth in the Frozen Four semifinals at Herb Brooks Arena in Lake Placid in front of a crowd of 3,225. The teams traded blows early before Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, KS) blasted a slapshot past UMD goalie Riitta Schaublin to give BC a 2-1 lead heading into the first intermission.

The lead was short-lived as the Bulldogs knotted the score just 52 seconds into the second. The Eagles were poised, however, and went right back on the attack, regaining the advantage when Becky Zavisza (Suffield, CT) tipped home an Erin Blood (Plymouth, MN) shot to put BC ahead, 3-2.

UMD would tie things up late in the third period to send the tired teams into an overtime marathon. The game marked BC's third multiple-overtime game of the year. They won the previous two, defeating Harvard 4-3 in triple OT and needing two extra sessions to get by Dartmouth, 3-2, in the NCAA quarterfinals. For Minnesota-Duluth, it was their third straight OT game after falling to Minnesota before slipping past Mercyhurst 3-2 in the NCAAAs.

The first extra session belonged to Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) as the freshman sensation was once again on top of her game, tallying 15 saves to keep the Eagles alive. Schaus ended her rookie campaign in the Top 10 nationally in six major goaltending categories including goals-against-average,

save percentage, and shutouts as well as earning ITECH Second Team All-Star goaltender and Mission All-Rookie team honors in Hockey East.

Her heroics, however, could not stave off elimination as UMD's Jessica Koizumi potted the overtime game-winner for the second week in a row to send the Bulldogs to a finals date with Wisconsin. The Badgers would defend their crown on Sunday, downing Duluth, 4-1 in the championship game.

Coach Tom Mutch's young squad finished the year with 24 wins, the most by BC as a varsity program. The team loses only two players to graduation, a scary proposition for the rest of the Hockey East coaches.

TPS Hockey Player of the Year Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH) led a dynamic offense as her 54 points tied for 6th in the country. Classmate and Mission All-Rookie team member Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, MN) is not to be overlooked as she finished 15th overall in points while tying for 2nd in the nation with 30 goals.

Mutch's coaching job has not gone unnoticed as the Hockey East CCM Coach of the Year was recently named one of seven finalists for the AHCA Division I Coach of the Year award, to be announced on April 28.

The Eagles certainly picked up their fair share of hardware, but they weren't the only Hockey East team earning accolades this week. Hockey East champion New Hampshire boasted the league's only Patty Kazmaier finalist in Hockey East First Team

All-Star defenseman Martine Garland (Toronto, ON). Though Harvard's Julie Chu took home the award on Saturday, Garland, only a junior, was named the winner of the USCHO Sportsmanship Award and will be back to help the Wildcats defend the title next season against those soaring Eagles and the rest of Hockey East. *-Scott Donnelly*
