UNH AND UCONN SPLIT; BC BEATS RPI IN OT ~Vermont sweeps Sacred Heart; BU, NU play tough in Minnesota~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. — The UNH Wildcats and UConn Huskies both came away with wins against nationally ranked opponents on the weekend, while Vermont swept Sacred Heart in their weekend series at Gutterson Fieldhouse. Both Boston University and Northeastern had competitive showings at the Nike Bauer Women's Classic hosted by the University of Minnesota. Boston College capped off Sunday with a 2-1 overtime win at Rensselaer as sophomore forward Allie Thunstrom gave the Eagles the win just 2:29 in the extra session. Hockey East teams picked up five wins in non-conference play over the weekend, which included eight of 12 games featuring nationally ranked opponents.

The No. 3 ranked Wildcats started the season on a high note with a 4-2 victory against No. 4 St. Lawrence on Friday night coming back from a one-goal deficit to light the lamp three times in the final period in Canton, N.Y. Steph Holmes notched the game-winner at 10:36 of the third period, while freshman goaltender Kayley Herman amassed 16 saves in her first collegiate start and victory for the Wildcats. UNH was shut out by St. Lawrence the next day for the first time in 81 games. UConn was defeated 3-2 by No. 10 ranked Ohio State in the season opener in Storrs, while the Huskies rebounded the next night for a convincing 5-2 victory to earn the split. Michelle Binning and Dominique Thibault each recorded three points is the OSU series over the weekend, while sophomore netminder Jennie Bellonio tallied 34 saves in her first career win against the Buckeyes in just her second collegiate start. Boston University skated to a 2-2 tie on Friday in the opening game of the Nike Bauer Women's Classic, while Northeastern battled Minnesota in a 5-3 loss in the late game. The next night the Terriers lost to the Gophers, 4-2, while the Huskies skated to a 2-2 with North Dakota. BU's Melissa Haber made 38 saves in the losing effort against Minnesota, while Kristi Kehoe of Northeastern had three points in her first collegiate game vs. the Gophers.

Vermont picked up two wins in a weekend sweep of Sacred Heart with a 5-1 win on Saturday and a 8-2 decision on Sunday night led by a five-point effort from freshman Teddy Fortin and four points from Kate Lesniak. Maine had a tough test with No. 2 ranked Mercyhurst over the weekend playing hard in two losses, which included a great effort from junior goaltender Genevieve Turgeon, who posted a career-high 62 saves in Friday's game against the Lakers.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles are now 7-7 all-time in season openers. Boston College owns a 7-0 all-time mark against Rensselaer. Sophomore forward Allie Thunstrom notched her sixth career game-winning goal on Sunday against the Engineers.

Boston University: The Terriers faced North Dakota and Minnesota last weekend, marking the first time in the program's history they faced WCHA opponents. BU will continue a tough early season schedule facing No. 2 ranked Mercyhurst in a weekend series in Erie, Pa.

University of Connecticut: The Huskies defeating Ohio State marked the fifth time UConn has upset a ranked opponent in the past two years. It was the first time since the start of the UConn program in 2001, that the Huskies defeated Ohio State and it was the teams' sixth meeting. Jaclyn Hawkins scored her 56th career goal, still leading the UConn program in career goals, assists and points.

University of Maine: Junior goaltender Genevieve Turgeon was four saves shy of tying a school record held by Amanda Cronin who had 66 against Brown in the 1997-98 inaugural season. She ranks third on the all-time career saves list at the University of Maine.

University of New Hampshire: UNH won its sixth consecutive season opener. The opener at SLU was the Wildcats' first season opener against a nationally-ranked team since skating to a 1-1 tie at fourthranked Minnesota in October 1998. UNH scored a goal in 81 consecutive games before being shut out by St. Lawrence.

Northeastern University: Husky captain Nikki Petrich will reach 100 games played in her collegiate career in her next appearance for Northeastern. The Huskies have recorded a total of four goals in third period play this season (two games). The Huskies currently have three players who have recorded multiple point games; Katy Applin, Cassie Sperry and Kristi Kehoe.

Providence College: The Frians open the 2007-08 season with an away game versus Maine on October 14. Under head coach Bob Deraney the Friars have posted a 3-5-0 record in season openers, including a 1-1 mark versus HE opponents. The Friars last win versus an HE opponent to begin a season was in 2003, when PC defeated Vermont by a score of 5-1 at Schneider Arena. PC has won three of the five Hockey East Tournament Championships in league history.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts start the season 2-0-0 for the first time in seven seasons as a Division I program. Kate Lesniak recorded Vermont's first Division I hat trick in Saturday's 5-2 win. After not scoring a shorthanded goal in all 32 games a year ago, Vermont tallied a shorthanded goal in both games to start the season. Ten freshmen saw action in UVM's first two games and accounted for five goals and 11 assists.
