BC AND VERMONT STAY PERFECT

~Maine and Providence skate to 2-2 tie in first league game~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – The Maine Black Bears and Providence College Friars skated to a 2-2 overtime tie on Sunday afternoon at Alford Arena in Orono to officially begin the 2007-2008 Hockey East schedule. The game was a defensive battle with Maine goaltender Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, Que.) posting a game-high 40 saves, giving her 102 saves in her last two starts for the Black Bears, while Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) made 29 saves for the Friars in their season opener. The last five games between the two teams have gone to overtime with Providence winning one game and the other four ending in a tie.

Boston College improved to 3-0 on the year with non-conference wins over Colgate (3-0) on Friday at Conte Forum and at Quinnipiac (4-2) on Saturday. Sophomore goaltender Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.) recorded 48 saves on the weekend with her fifth career shutout on Friday vs. the Red Raiders. Vermont scored another eight goals this past weekend to up its record to 4-0, the best start in the program's history with a weekend sweep of Union at Gutterson Fieldhouse. Kristen Olychuck (Kelowna, B.C.) was solid for the Catamounts in net with 18 saves in her first career shutout on Friday against the Dutchwomen. Seven different Catamounts found the back of the net last weekend against Union to continue the balanced offense attack for UVM.

UConn took home its third straight victory with a weekend sweep of the Minnesota State Mavericks at Freitas Ice Forum. Player of the Week Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Ont.) and Jaclyn Hawkins (Manotick, Ont.) continued their dominant play for the Huskies with five and four points respectively. Junior Brittany Wilson (Nepean, Ont.) was the backbone of the team posting 51 saves in the two-game set, while amassing 29 saves in her sixth career shutout on Friday.

The UNH Wildcats pulled out a close 1-0 victory on Sunday vs. Colgate at the Whittemore Center, thanks to Sam Faber (Mt. Sinai, N.Y.) who scored with 2:10 remaining in the third period to break the scoreless tie. Freshman goalie Kayley Herman (Weyburn, Sask.) picked up her second collegiate victory for the Wildcats and posted 23 saves for her first career shutout.

Boston University gave No. 2 ranked Mercyhurst a serious battle on Friday night in a 6-5 loss in Erie, while the Terriers were defeated 4-1 on the series finale on Saturday. Erin Seman (Ramsey, Minn.) had four points in the losing cause for the Terriers on Friday, while BU netminder Melissa Haber (Toronto, Ont.) had 65 saves in the series, including 36 stops on Saturday. Northeastern is still looking for its first victory on the season after a close 4-3 loss at Quinnipiac on Friday, Chelsea Jones (Lake Elmo, Minn.) led the Huskies offensive attack with two goals in the losing effort against the Bobcats.

Boston College: Allie Thunstrom has recorded at least one point in the three games this season...She leads the team with five points...Maggie Taverna has also recorded at least one point in the three games this season.

Boston University: Junior Erin Seman matched the team record with three assists against Mercyhurst on Friday...Both junior Amanda Shaw and sophomore Melissa Anderson had three assist games during their respective rookie seasons - Shaw on 10/23/05, Anderson on 2/24/07...Anderson's goal against Mercyhurst with 15:59 left in the first period on Friday was the first the Lakers have surrendered this season, after shutting out Robert Morris, 3-0, and twice blanking Maine, 4-0 and 5-0...BU scored four of the team's five goals on Friday on the power play...The Terriers went 4-for-7 on the power play in during the 6-5 loss to Mercyhurst.

University of Connecticut: Brittany Wilson recorded sixth career shut-out...UConn has won three straight games this season...Nicole Tritter recorded two goals, one in each game against the Mavericks.

University of Maine: Over the past three seasons Maine and Providence have skated to four straight ties at Alford Arena...In her career, Maine is 13-5-1 when Vanessa Vani scores a goal...Five out of the 12 goals Maine has given up this season have been on the penalty kill...Six out of the eight goals Maine has scored have been even strength...Maine is undefeated at home so far this season.

University of New Hampshire: UNH improved to 25-5-1, including 5-0-1 under head coach Brian McCloskey, in home openers...The overall mark also includes a 10-2-1 mark at the Whittemore Center...Ten of the 25 victories have been by shutout...With the win against Colgate, UNH kept intact its streak of not losing consecutive games since Nov. 28 & Dec. 1, 2004. In head coach Brian McCloskey's tenure, the Wildcats have lost back-to-back games just five times... In just her second career appearance (and start), Kayley Herman recorded her first career shutout with a personal-best 23 saves against Colgate.

Northeastern University: Senior Captain Nikki Petrich played in her 100th career game on Friday at Quinnipiac and scored her 31st career goal in the game...With Chelsey Jones' two-goal performance at Quinnipiac, The Huskies now have four players who have recorded multiple point games this season: Jones, Kristi Kehoe, Katy Applin and Cassie Sperry...The game also marked Jones' fourth career multiple-goal game...The Huskies have outplayed their opponents in the third period this season, out-shooting them 35-25 and also have a 4-2 scoring advantage in the 3rd.

Providence College: Dating back to January 1, 2006 Providence and Maine have now played in five straight overtime contests...Providence has posted a 1-0-4 record in those five games...Dating back to February 10 of last season, the Friars have registered at least one power-play goal in six of their last seven games.

University of Vermont: Off to its best start in program history, Vermont swept Union, 4-0 and 4-1, to run its season-opening winning streak to four...Seven different Catamounts scored in the two wins over the Dutchwomen to continue Vermont's balanced attack...Through the first four contests, 13 different Catamounts have accounted for the team's 21 goals while 19 players have recorded at least one point... Kate Lesniak scored her team-high fourth goal Friday night and added an assist Saturday to run her streak of scoring a point to five games dating back to the final game of the 2006-07 season...Kristen Olychuck made 18 saves in Friday's 4-0 win over Union for her first career shutout.
