PC AND BC MEET IN HUGE SERIES; NO. 2 UNH AND NO. 8 UCONN PLAY TWO ~Three teams fighting for two playoff spots still on the table~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. — Providence College (15-14-3, 10-7-2 WHEA) needs one point to clinch a playoff spot

in its upcoming series with Boston College (13-13-6, 8-9-2 WHEA), which begins on Friday, in a rare afternoon game at Conte Forum. The Eagles need to earn at least two points in the weekend series to keep their playoff hopes alive. BC sophomore Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, Ohio) scored all the game-winning goals in the last three Eagles' wins. PC senior defenseman Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ont.) ranks first in the nation for goals by a defenseman with 15. Smith is also fourth in the nation with a 0.91 points per game mark among blue-liners. PC won the only meeting with BC on October 30, 3-2 at Conte Forum. The Friars have scored 17 goals in their last three victories, before dropping two decisions to first-place New Hampshire.

The No. 2 ranked New Hampshire Wildcats (28-3-1, 18-0-1 WHEA) will look to extend their conference record 36-game unbeaten steak (33-0-3) in league play against No. 8 Connecticut (22-5-5, 13-3-3 WHEA). In the first meeting of the season series, the 'Cats downed the Huskies, 8-2, at the

Whittemore Center in Durham. This game features the top four leading scorers in league play with UNH's Sam Faber (Mt. Sinai, N.Y.) and Jenn Wakefield (Pickering, Ont.) leading the way with 30 points apiece. UConn's Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Ont.) and Jaclyn Hakwins (Manotick, Ont.) rank third and fourth respectively with 29 and 28 points in conference games.

Boston University (13-16-3, 9-9-1 WHEA) and Northeastern will begin their series on Saturday afternoon at Walter Brown Arena. If the Terriers win or tie and Providence defeats BC, the Terriers will clinch their first playoff berth in school history. BU can also clinch a playoff spot by earning at least three points. They could also possibly leapfrog Providence for the third spot in the league playoffs with a weekend sweep. BU won the meeting in the series opener on January 13, 3-1, at Matthews Arena.

Maine and Vermont being their two-game series on Saturday at Alfond Arena to close out their respective seasons. The two teams skated to the first 0-0 tie in league history, in their first meeting the season series on November 24 at Gutterson Fieldhouse. Junior Vanessa Vani (St. Catharine's, Ont.) has tallied seven points (1g,6a) in her last five games. Freshmen Celeste Doucet (Memramcook, N.B.) and Teddy Fortin (Brunswick, Maine) lead the Catamounts in scoring with 12 points apiece, the most by Vermont rookies in the program's seven years in Division I. Twenty-three of UVM's 48 goals this year have been scored by freshmen.

zen Four weekend. Sophomore forward
Dominique Thibault ranks seventh in the
nation scoring 1.57 points per game.
