UNH WILDCATS BOUND FOR FROZEN FOUR IN DULUTH

~No. 3 seed UNH faces off against host No. 2 Minnesota-Duluth~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – Senior forward Sadie Wright-Ward (Durham, N.H.) of the No. 3 seed University of New Hampshire scored the game-winning overtime goal just 2:40 into the extra frame for a 3-2 triumph over No. 6 St. Lawrence on Saturday afternoon at the Whittemore Center to propel the Wildcats to their second Frozen Four berth in school history.

Freshman forward Courtney Birchard (Mississauga, Ont.) pulled UNH even, 1-1, at 6:28 of the first period with a strong individual effort. Hockey East Rookie of the Year Jenn Wakefield (Pickering, Ont.) evened the game at 2-2 with 6:32 left in regulation on the power play for her 26th goal of the season. Freshman netminder Kayley Herman (Weyburn, Sask.) made 20 stops for the Wildcats in her 29th win of the season of the season, which marks a new single-season school record.

UNH, which gained one of the three automatic berths to the NCAA's by capturing the Hockey East tournament title for a third consecutive year, extended its winning streak to 13 games and unbeaten streak to 19 games (18-0-1) to improve to 33-3-1. The Wildcats head into the conference schedule next season with a 38-game conference unbeaten streak (35-0-3) intact.

The 'Cats will face off against host Minnesota-Duluth (32-4-1, 24-4-0 WCHA) on Thursday, March 20 at 9pm (EST) at the Duluth Entertainment Convention Center in Duluth, Minn. in the second semifinal match up of the 2008 Frozen Four. UNH has a 2-2-0 all-time record against Duluth, with the last meetings coming in December of 2000. UMD swept the series that year by scores of 3-0 and 8-1. New Hampshire has a 2-2 overall record in the NCAA tournament play following last weekend's 3-2 overtime win vs. St. Lawrence in the quarterfinals. In 2007, the Wildcats lost (6-2) at home to SLU in the quarterfinals. In UNH's first NCAA tourney appearance (2006), the team recorded a 3-1 home win vs. Harvard in the quarterfinals and a 5-4 loss at Minnesota in the '06 Frozen Four semifinal. UNH compiled a 6-2-0 regular-season record vs. the 2008 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Championship field. In addition to the road split against St. Lawrence, the Wildcats defeated top-seeded Harvard University, 4-1, Dec. 14 at the Whittemore Center.

Herman recorded 20 saves, including a handful from point-blank range, to backbone the Wildcats to a 3-2 OT victory vs. St. Lawrence in the NCAA quarterfinals. She made half of her saves in the second stanza.

HOCKEY EAST WEEKLY TOP PERFORMERS

Kacey Bellamy, UNH (Jr., D; Westfield, Mass.) Tallyed an assist on UNH's two goals in regulation, both of which eliminated a one-goal deficit. Her pass in the neutral zone sprung Courtney Birchard for her second-period goal, along with a touch-pass set up Jenn Wakefield's PPG at 13:28 in the third; that goal forced the extra session.

TEAM NOTES

University of New Hampshire: UNH advanced to the Frozen Four for the second time in three years with a 3-2 overtime win against St. Lawrence in an NCAA home quarterfinal game...It was UNH's first NCAA tournament overtime game (four tourney games)...The 'Cats are 2-0-1 in OT this season and 4-0-7 in the last 11 games decided beyond regulation...Kayley Herman (Weyburn, Sask.) had her shutout streak come to an end at 149:20 with SLU's first-period goal...Jennifer Hitchcock (LaSalle, Ont.) tied her career high of two assists in the NCAA quarterfinal game...UNH is 7-2 in games decided by one goal this season...The Wildcats had not allowed more than one goal in a game since Jan. 26 (11 games)...UNH topped 1,000 in attendance for the fifth time this season with a mark of 1,607 for the NCAA quarterfinal game...Saturday's game marked just the fifth time this season that UNH trailed at the first intermission, as well as the sixth time the team trailed through two periods.

UNH NCAA Notes: New Hampshire has a 2-2 overall record in the NCAA tournament play following last weekend's 3-2 overtime win vs. St. Lawrence in the quarterfinals. In 2007, the Wildcats lost (6-2) at home to SLU in the quarterfinals. In UNH's first NCAA tourney appearance (2006), the team recorded a 3-1 home win vs. Harvard in the quarterfinals and a 5-4 loss at Minnesota in the '06 Frozen Four semifinal. UNH has a 5-3 record in national championship tournaments, including the American Women's College Hockey Alliance (AWCHA) from 1998-2000. The 'Cats won the inaugural AWCHA national title in 1998 by defeating Minnesota in the semifinal; and Brown in the title game at Boston's TD Banknorth Garden. They finished as runner-up in 1999 with an overtime win against Minnesota and an OT loss to Harvard. The 'Cats are 2-1 in postseason play against the WCHA, all vs. Minnesota. In addition to the aforementioned '06 Frozen Four, UNH upended the Golden Gophers in the 1998 AWCHA semifinal (4-1) and 1999 AWCHA semifinal (3-2 in overtime).

Hockey East in the Frozen Four: In the six-year history of the league, it marks the third Hockey East team to reach the Frozen Four, which includes the second appearance by the Wildcats. The league tournament champion did not receive a berth in the tournament until the 2004-2005 season. Providence College was the first Hockey East team to appear in the NCAA tournament in March of 2005, a 6-1 quarterfinal loss to Minnesota. UNH earned its first appearance in the NCAA tournament and in the Frozen Four in 2006. The Wildcats lost to host Minnesota on March 24, 2006 (5-4) in Minneapolis. The Boston College Eagles went to the 2007 Frozen Four with a 3-2 double overtime win vs. Dartmouth in the NCAA quarterfinals on March 10, 2007 in Lake Placid, N.Y. The Eagles faced Minnesota-Duluth and lost a 4-3 double overtime game. Hockey East teams own a 3-3 record all-time in NCAA tournament games and a 0-2 record in Frozen Four play.
