HOCKEY EAST ANNOUNCES 08-09 WOMEN'S COMPOSITE SCHEDULE ~League announces new playoff format for upcoming season~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - The Hockey East Association and commissioner Joe Bertagna announced the 2008-2009 league women's composite schedule on Thursday afternoon, which features a 21-game league schedule for each of the eight member schools in addition to several marquee out of conference matchups throughout the season.

The 08-09 WHEA season opens with two exhibition contests on Friday, September 26, as Dawson plays at Connecticut's Freitas Ice Forum and 2008 Frozen Four participant New Hampshire hosts Brampton at the Whittemore Center in Durham.

The conference officially kicks off regular-season play on Saturday, September 27 as UConn will host Sacred Heart in Storrs, Conn. for a single game (4pm). The remainder of the league will kick off the regular season the next weekend. On Friday, October 3, Providence College will host the Ohio State Buckeyes in the beginning of the two-game series, while Maine hosts WCHA foe North Dakota at Alfond Arena in Orono. Northeastern and first-year head coach Dave Flint will open the season on the road on Friday against Rensselaer and the Boston University Terriers open up against Union in Schenectady, N.Y. Boston College will host Clarkson for its home opener on Saturday, October 4. New Hampshire and BC will open the seventh annual league schedule on Wednesday, October 8 at the Whittemore Center, while Vermont opens with a two-game set at Union on Friday, October 10.

The regular season will determine the six teams that qualify for the Hockey East Championship Tournament. The league athletic directors voted to expand the tournament field to six teams at the annual conference meetings in Naples, Fla. in April of 2008. The third and fourth seeds in the tournament will host a quarterfinal round game on Saturday, February 28 or Sunday, March 1 on their respective campuses. The advancing teams will then be reseeded with the top two seeds to play on the site of the highest seed in the semifinal round on Saturday, March 7. The winners will qualify for the seventh annual Hockey East Championship Game on Sunday, March 8. The game will be televised by the New England Sports Network (NESN). The winner of the league tournament will receive an automatic berth into the 2009 NCAA Tournament for a chance to play in the Frozen Four on Friday, March 20 hosted by league member Boston University and Agganis Arena.

The Women's Hockey East Association is an eight-team, Division-I college hockey conference which began play in 2002-2003, with offices based in Wakefield, Mass. The league also sponsors an 10 team men's league which began play in 1984-1985.
