## **NORTHEASTERN SWEEPS OPENING WEEKEND IN NEW YORK** ~BC, BU, UConn, Maine victorious in first full slate of non-league action~

WAKEFIELD. Mass. - Northeastern first-year head coach Dave Flint guided Northeastern to victory in his first two contests at the helm of the Huskies hockey program. NU defeated ECAC foe Rensselaer, 3-2, in the opener on Friday and shutout Union, 6-0, on Saturday afternoon.

Hockey East Player of the Week Kristi Kehoe (Bakersfield, Calif.) had a five-point weekend for the Huskies, including her first career hat trick on Saturday vs. the Dutchwomen. Sophomore goalie Leah Sulyma (Inuvik, N.W.T.) also picked up her second career shutout for Northeastern on Saturday.

Connecticut also continued its torrid goal scoring pace with a 5-2 win at Minnesota State on Friday. On Saturday, the Huskies were kept in check as the Mavericks took a 4-2 win.

Boston College also took a win and a tie out of its weekend series with Clarkson at Conte Forum. The Eagles blanked the Golden Knights, 2-0, on Saturday and they battled to a 4-4 tie on Sunday in Chestnut Hill. BC returns to action for the league opener on Wednesday at New Hampshire.

Senior goalie Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, Que.), the Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week, picked up where she left off last season, recording 92 saves on the weekend. Turgeon totaled 46 saves with a .958 save percentage in the 3-2 victory vs. North Dakota on Friday at Alfond Arena.

Boston University earned a weekend split in New York, as the Terriers took the Friday game at Union, 3-2. Mission Rookie of the Week Jenelle Kohanchuk (Winnipeg, Man.) scored three points (1g,2a) in her collegiate debut, which included the game-winner. Senior netminder Allyse Wilcox (Grand Blanc, Mich.) also had a solid opening weekend for the Terriers, posting 45 saves. Providence College lost a pair of one-goal games to Ohio State at Schneider Arena.

Vermont lost a 1-0 exhibition to McGill University on Sunday night at Gutterson Fieldhouse. Kristen Olychuck made 32 saves in the losing effort.

## TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC is now 3-2-2 against Clarkson since the two teams began competition in 2004...The Eagles only allowed one powerplay goal on the weekend and scored two short handed goals...Six of BC's seven freshman saw action over the weekend with Danielle Welch recording her first collegiate goal and Andrea Green (Chanhassen, Minn.) her first point on Kelli Stack's shorthanded goal on Saturday.

**Boston University:** Freshman Jenelle Kohanchuk scored three points in her collegiate debut, the first BU rookie to do that since Melissa Anderson (Langley, B.C.) in 2006...BU is now 2-1-1 all-time in season openers...BU remained undefeated in six all-time meetings with Union..Junior Sarah Appleton (New Canaan, Conn.) scored BU's first goal of the year with assists from Kohanchuk and sophomore Jillian Kirchner (Frankfort, III.).

University of Connecticut: Cristin Allen has assisted at least one goal in each game of the regular-season, including two assists against Sacred Heart (Sept. 27) and in the Huskies' first game against MSU on Oct. 3...Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Ont.) has scored at least one goal in each game this season, including a pair of power-play goals against the Mavericks. With one in Friday's game and another on Saturday, Thibault leads the team with two this season. She finished with a team best six power-play goals last season...All four freshman skaters who have seen game action this year have scored at least one goal. Sami Evelyn recorded her first goal on Saturday, while Jaclyn Camardo (Arlington Heights, III.), Reberca Hewett (Dak Bluff, Man.) and Monique Weber (Rogers, Minn.) all scored in their first college game (Sacred Heart; Sept. 27).

University of Maine: Senior netminder Genevieve Turgeon recorded her 2,000th career save with the Black Bears over the weekend. She now has 2,065, which has shattered Maine's school record...Maine is now 5-1 all-time against North Dakota. The two teams began playing each other during the 2005-2006 season...The Black Bears are now 9-3 in the regular season opening games...After recording only 11 power play goals in 2007-08, Maine already has four in the first two games of 2008-09...Vanessa Vani is also close to breaking into the top five of the Black Bears' all-time point list. She has 74 career points, needing only five more to move into a tie for fifth place...Maine will travel to Minnesota State next weekend where Dan Lichterman spent four years as an assistant coach before becoming the head coach at Maine.

University of New Hampshire: New Hampshire has a 27-3-1 overall record in season openers that includes 12-2-0 at home (4-1-0 at the Whittemore Center). UNH has won six straight season openers dating back to a 4-3 loss to Ohio State to start the 2002 season...UNH has a 25-5-1 record in home openers. The Wildcats have won four straight home openers and are 5-0-1 in the last six. The last loss was that setback to Ohio State in the '02 season...New Hampshire is 5-1-1 when the home opener is a league opponent. In Hocky East play, that includes the 2006 season win vs. Maine as well as a 1-1 tie vs. UConn in the '04 season...The Wildcats carry a 38-game regular season Hockey East unbeaten streak (35-0-3) into Wednesday's opener against Boston College; including postseason, that streaks stands at 42 games (39-0-3). The Eagles were the last league team to defeat the 'Cats (Av. 2, 2006; 7-2)...UNH is 53-0-7 in home league regular-season games since the inception of Hockey East in the 2003 season. The 'Cats are also 2-0 in postseason Hockey East home games.

Northeastern University: The Huskies start the season 2-0 for the first time since 2001-02...Last year's standout goaltender Leah Sulyma (Inuvik, N.W.T) earned a shutout in her first start of the season against Union, making 6 saves...Freshman goalie Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) earned the win over Rensselaer Oct. 3, making 38 saves on 40 shots.

**Providence College:** Providence goalies combined for 54 saves on the weekend, which included 32 saves by freshman goalie Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) in her first collegiate start for the Friars...Providence hosts St. Lawrence on Friday. The Friars have lost three in a row to St. Lawrence. The Friars also entertain Colgate on Saturday. Providence is undefeated against Colgate in its last 4 games...The Friar offense has been led by the freshman class in the first two games of the season. Two freshmen scored their first collegiate goals over the weekend.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts dropped a 1-0 decision to McGill in an exhibition tuneup Sunday at Gutterson Fieldhouse...Junior goalie Kristen Olychuck (Kelowna, B.C.) made 32 saves against the defending Canadian champions in the preseason tuneup...Vermont opens its 2008-09 regular season at Union Friday at 7:00pm and Saturday at 3:00pm.
