TERRIERS SPLIT WITH NO. 5 MERCYHURST; UVM WINS TWO ON ROAD ~No. 1 UNH sweeps Niagara and downs BC in first WHEA shootout~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – Boston University rebounded from a 4-2 loss on Friday night to No. 5 Mercyhurst and posted a 3-2 victory against the Lakers on Saturday at Walter Brown Arena. It marked the Terriers first all-time win against Mercyhurst and it also was the highest ranked team BU had ever defeated.

The No. 4 ranked New Hampshire Wildcats started the week on Wednesday with a shootout win against Boston College, which marked the first in the history of the league. The Wildcats then picked up a pair of road wins at Niagara on Saturday (5-3) and Sunday (5-2). Pure Hockey Player of the Week Jenn Wakefield (Pickering, Ont.) recorded a team best seven points (3g,4a) on the week. Wakefield scored a career-high four points vs. the Purple Eagles on Oct. 11.

Vermont took two games from at Union over the weekend. The Catamounts opened with a 7-2 win on Friday and tallied a 3-1 victory to complete the sweep of the Dutchwomen. Freshman Erin Barley-Maloney (Raleigh, N.C.) had four points (2g,2a) over the weekend.

The Huskies of Connecticut registered a 4-1 win over Colgate on Friday at Freitas Ice Forum and then followed that up with a 4-4 tie against No. 6 St. Lawrence on Saturday. Providence lost to the Saints, 3-1, on Friday and then bounced back on Saturday with a 6-2 triumph over Colgate in Providence.

No. 10 ranked Boston College earned a 5-2 win against Rensselaer on Saturday in Chestnut Hill. Northeastern University remained unbeaten with two ties at Bemidji State. The Huskies held BSU to only two goals all weekend. NU freshman goalie Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) recorded a 40-save shutout in the 0-0 deadlock on Friday night. Schelling was named Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week for her efforts.

Maine lost a pair of games at Minnesota State on Friday and Saturday. Senior goalie Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, Que.) made 77 saves for the Black Bears on the road trip.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Four freshman recorded points in Saturday's game against RPI. Forwards Andrea Green and Danielle Welch both recorded a goal and Welch also had one assist. Freshman Mary Restuccia had two goals and an assist and defenseman Kristin Regan recorded her first collegiate point on an assist...Junior Kelli Stack scored both of BC's goals in Wednesday's contest against UNH, she leads the team in both goals (5), power play goals (3) and points (8).

Boston University: Saturday's 3-2 win over No. 5 Mercyhurst marked the highest-ranked team the Terriers ever beaten. The biggest previous upset in BU history was a 3-1 win over No. 8 Boston College on Jan. 19, 2007...Junior Jonnie Bloemers (Brooklyn Center, Minn.) scored the game-winning goal on Saturday, the third game-winner of her career and the second against a nationally-ranked opponent...The Terriers three-goal comeback in the third period of Saturday's win was the most goals BU has scored in a period since netting four in the third period against Sacred Heart on Dec. 8, 2007...BU earned its first-ever win against Mercyhurst on Saturday in its fourth try.

University of Connecticut: Uconn has scored on at least one power-play goal in every game this season. Third on the team in points and has yet to score a goal, defenseman Cristin Allen (Pickering, Ont.) has assisted her teammates eight times this season, including two this weekend. Allen is second on the team in +/- with a +10 rating...Four members of the rookie class have already scored their first collegiate goal a mere five games into the season. Sami Evelyn opened scoring in the second game at Minnesota State-Mankato assisted by fellow freshmen Rebecca Hewett and Monique Weber. Weber currently leads the rookie class with six points after scoring against SLU.

University of Maine: Vanessa Vani (Sr., F, St. Catharines, Quebec) had a goal on Friday night that gives her 75 career points, only four away from breaking into the Black Bears top-five all-time point list...Maine will host Sacred Heart next weekend, who they beat in the first game of last season 6-1 and was one of only three teams they were able to defeat...The Black Bears were held scoreless for the first time in 2008-09 on Saturday, they were held scoreless 10 times in 2007-08...Senior goalie Genevieve Turgeon now has 169 saves for the season, 2142 for her career.

University of New Hampshire: New Hampshire is now 39-2-3 lifetime vs. BC following a 2-2 tie in the season opener...UNH extended its league-record regular-season unbeaten streak to 39 games (36-0-3) with that draw against the Eagles...Sam Faber is tied for 10th on the program's all-time assist list with Martine Garland and Robin Balducci at 86...The Wildcats have surrendered 2+ goals in all three games this season; the Wildcats did not allow 2+ goals in three consecutive games the entire 2008 season...Five of the opposition's seven goals scored this season have been power-play tallies...The 'Cats potted goals 25 seconds apart Oct. 11 and 26 seconds apart Oct. 12 vs. Niagara.

Northeastern University: Sophomore forwards Kristi Kehoe and Alyssa Wohlfeiler have combined for 9 of NU's 11 goals so far this season. The pair played on the same California Selects teams since 2004-05, and the chemistry appears to be paying off...NU's two goalies have posted impressive numbers through four games. With two starts each, Sophomore Leah Sulyma and Freshman Florence Schelling both have a .96 GAA. Sulyma has a .958 save percentage, and Schelling a .975...The Huskies are currently riding a four-game unbeaten streak, going 2-0-2 in their first four games. This is their longest unbeaten streak since 2003-04, when the Huskies strung together a five-game streak from Jan. 18 through Feb. 6.

Providence College: Six Friars posted multi-point games vs Colgate...Friars scored four power-play goals and one short-handed goal in the victory. It was the most power play goals the Friars have scored since a 5-1 victory over Northeastern on October 21, 2006...Last season, the Friars went 2-1 vs the Huskies. Providence scored 16 goals in the three games. In the last meeting, an 8-3 victory for the Friars, Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) registered a hat-trick while Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) tallied 4 assists.

University of Vermont: Vermont opened the season with a two-game sweep at Union topping the Dutchwomen, 7-2, on Friday and 3-1 on Saturday...UVM's 10 goals in the two games came from eight different players...Fourteen different Catamounts registered at least one point...Including finishing the 2007-08 season with a pair of victories at Maine, the Catamounts have won four straight road games after dropping a NCAA-record 34 straight road games from 2005 to 2008...Vermont opens at home Saturday hosting Connecticut in its Hockey East opener at 2 p.m. UVM also takes on Providence Sunday at 3 p.m. at Gutterson Fieldhouse.
