WEEKEND SCHEDULE FEATURES 10 NON-LEAGUE GAMES ~No. 7 BC hosts Northeastern on Sunday at Conte Forum~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - No. 7 ranked Boston College will kickoff the weekend with a 12pm game against Princeton on Friday afternoon, while Maine plays a two-game set at Robert Morris beginning Friday night. Connecticut will also host the Nutmeg Classic at Freitas Ice Forum in Storrs. BC and Northeastern will skate in the only conference game of the holiday weekend on Sunday.

The Eagles are 3-1-1 in non-league play this year and they look to continue that success on Friday, Junior netminder Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.) ranks second among league netminders with a 1.80 GAA. The Black Bears lost a pair of one-goal games to Robert Morris last year and they are coming off a shootout loss to Vermont on Tuesday. Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beuport, Que.) tallied 31 saves in the shootout loss.

UConn will play Wayne State in the first round of the Nutmeg Classic on Friday and will conclude with either Quinnipiac or Yale on Saturday. The Huskies are coming off a 4-0 shutout of Brown on Tuesday. Junior forward Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Ont.), who scored two goals in the win vs. Brown, leads the team in scoring with 21 points (14g,7a).

On Saturday, No. 5 UNH travels to Colgate for the single game, while Providence College plays rival Brown in the Mayor's Cup. Vermont will start a two-game series with Clarkson on Saturday at Cheel Arena in Potsdam, N.Y.

The Wildcats are coming off a 2-0 shutout of Northeastern at the Whittemore Center on Tuesday night. Sophomore goalie Kayley Herman (Weyburn, Sask,) notched her first shutout of the season for the Wildcats. NU freshman Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) also played well in net with a 34-save performance in the losing effort.

The Friars are 3-1-1 in their last five games, they are coming off a 2-2 tie vs. Niagara last Saturday. PC won last year's meeting with Brown, 5-2, at Schneider Arena.

The Catamounts won their first ever shootout in school history vs. Maine in Lewiston on Tuesday night. Chelsea Furlani (Colchester, Vt.) and Peggy Wakeham (Bay Roberts, Nfld.) notched goals for UVM, while Teddy Fortin (Brunswick, Maine) notched the shootout clincher. Kristen Olychuck (Kelowna, B.C.) also had a solid night with 32 saves in the Catamount net.

BC and NU will close out the holiday schedule on Sunday. The Eagles won the first meeting of the season by a decisive 5-0 score. The Huskies ranks first in the league in team defense at 1.60 goals per game, while BC's league offense in third best in the conference scoring 3.12 goals per contest.
