### NO. 5 BOSTON COLLEGE AND NO. 7 UNH SQUARE OFF THIS WEEKEND ~No. 8 UConn and Providence also kickoff home-and-home set~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - This weekend's league play is highlighted by a home and home series between No. 5 Boston College and No. 7 New Hampshire. No. 8 Connecticut will also play home and home with Providence. Vermont heads to BU for a two-game set, while Maine hosts Northeastern for a pair. Four games this weekend and three next weekend, beginning with Thursday's game at UNH, will celebrate this year's Skating Strides Against Breast Cancer initiative. Proceeds from gate admissions, merchandise sales, raffles and auctions will be donated to local breast cancer charities around New England. Each WHEA school will host one Skating Strides game over the course of the next two weekends of league play.

BC heads to the Whittemore Center Thursday night before hosting the Wildcats Friday evening. The teams last met on Oct. 8, opening WHEA regular season play. They battled to a 2-2 tie before UNH won the shootout 1-0. Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, Ohio) scored both goals for the Eagles, while UNH's offense was split between Sam Faber (Mt. Sinai, N.Y.) and Micaela Long (South Boston, Mass.). The Eagles will look to netminder Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.), who has posted a .960 save percentage and 1.15 goals allowed in January, while UNH hopes to keep its special teams strong. The Wildcats' penalty kill has been perfect 12-for-12 in its last three games.

No. 8 UConn and Providence will begin a home-and-home set beginning on Saturday afternoon at Schneider Arena in Provindence. The Friars have won three of their last four games heading into the weekend, allowing one goal or less in all of those victories. Providence won the first meeting of the season series, 2-0, on November 16 at PC. The Huskies, who come into the game having won 11 of their last 12 contests, are currently one of the hottest teams in the country. Junior forward Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Ont.) has recorded seven points (5g,2a) in her last five games for the Huskies. PC's rookie goalie Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) leads league play with an impressive GAA (1.10) and save percentage (.958) among conference netminders.

Northeastern will also head north for the weekend for a series with the Black Bears in Orono at Alfond Arena. The Huskies are coming off a 1-0 loss to UConn and Maine was sept last weekend bu UNH. In the first meeting of the season series at Northeastern, the Huskies came away with a 4-1 win on November 9. Northeastern's penalty kill ranks first in league play at 93.8%. Maine's Genevieve Turgeon (Lac Beauport, Que.) has amassed the most saves of any league goalie with 715 this season and she has logged the second most minutes (1,308).

Boston University and Vermont will play two games on the weekend at Walter Brown Arena, beginning on Friday night. The Catamounts won the first meeting of the season, 3-2, on December 5 in Burlington.
