## NO. 5 UNH FACES OFF AGAINST RIVAL PROVIDENCE; NO. 7 BC PLAYS BU ~No. 9 UConn travels north to Maine; NU plays UVM for two-game set~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - The No. 5 ranked New Hampshire Wildcats will begin a key league series with Providence on Friday night at Schneider Arena, while Connecticut travels to Maine's Alfond Arena beginning Friday afternoon at 2 p.m. On Saturday afternoon, No. 5 Boston College and cross-town rival Boston University will square off at Conte Forum at 1 p.m., while Northeastern and Vermont will commence their series at Matthews Arena.

The Wildcats will have a chance to clinch their fourth straight regular-season title on Saturday night with a two-win weekend against the Friars and the Eagles would need lose a point to BU on Saturday afternoon. The Friars won the first meeting of the season series, 5-0, at Schneider Arena on January 10. Since the loss, UNH has rattled off eight straight wins and has outscored their opponents 18 to 7, in its last five wins. The game will feature the league top offense in UNH (3.41 gpg) vs. the league's top ranked defense in PC (1.59). Providence rookie netminder Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) owns a 1.35 GAA and a .949 save percentage to lead the Friars and WHEA play.

BC and BU square off on Saturday afternoon, after the Eagles came off a 1-0 shutout of Harvard en route to the Beanpot Championship. Junior goalie Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.) had a seasonhigh 40 saves in her 20th of victory season for the Eagles. The Terriers are coming a a 2-1 win against Northeastern in the consolation game of the Beanpot on Tuesday. The two teams have split the two previous meetings by scores of 4-1 (BU) on Nov. 22 and 5-0 (BC) on Dec. 10.

UConn owns a 12-3-1 record in its ast 16 games and are coming off a tie and a loss to Boston University last weekend, while Maine is coming off a pair off losses to Boston College. On November 8. UConn won the first meeting between the two teams at Freitas Ice Forum in Storrs.

Northeastern won a 2-1 game vs. the Catamounts on December 6 for the only meeting of the season series. NU freshman goalie Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) made a WHEA high 53 saves on Feb. 6 in the 3-2 overtime loss to Providence College. Freshman forward Erin Barley-Maloney (Raleigh, N.C.) leads the Catamount squad in scoring with 17 points (6g,11a). The Catamounts are coming off a pair of losses to league leader New Hampshire during last weekend's action. The Huskies penalty kill ranks first in league play at 91.6%, while UVM has scored 12 of its 22 goals in league play in the second period this season.
