WHEA QUARTERFINAL PLAY SET TO COMMENCE SATURDAY

~**Boston University hosts Northeastern; Providence entertains Connecticut**~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – The Seventh Annual Women's Hockey East Tournament kicks off with two quarterfinal matchups on Saturday afternoon. The No. 3 seed Boston University will host the No. 6 seed, Northeastern, at 3pm at Walter Brown Arena, while No. 4 seeded Providence hosts No. 5 seeded Connecticut at Schneider Arena at 1pm. The top-seeded New Hampshire Wildcats and No. 2 Boston College earned a bye week for finishing in the top two spots in the league standings.

BU looks to continue its streak, as the Terriers are unbeaten in their last seven league games. The teams played a home and home series just last weekend, which BU swept, earning a 3-0 victory on Friday and 8-1 win Saturday. BU owned the season series 2-1, as the Huskies shut out the Terriers on Jan. 8. Netminder Leah Sulyma (Inuvik, NWT) posted a 31-save performance in the 2-0 shutout. BU is led offensively by Mission Rookie of the Week Jenelle Kohanchuk (Winnipeg, Man.) and junior Melissa Anderson (Langley, BC). Northeastern's Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) and Sulyma have posted .924 and .919 save percentages, respectively, in league play, ranking them fourth and fifth among netminders.

Providence is coming off a 1-1 tie against BC at Conte Forum, while the Huskies were swept by UNH last weekend. UConn ranks third in the league, averaging 2.94 goals per game while only allowing 2.12, good for second in the league. Providence is close behind, allowing 2.18 goals per game, behind the goaltending of rookie Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.). Lacasse has posted a .933 save percentage through the regular season, ranked second among netminders. UConn looks to the scoring tandem of Dominique Thibault (L'Orignal, Que.) and Michelle Binning (Oshawa, Ont.), who have tallied 38 and 30 points, respectively, this season, ranking them sixth and seventh in the league.
