NON-CONFERENCE ACTION DOMINATES WEEKEND WHEA SCHEDULE ~14 non-league games on tap for Friday and Saturday~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – WHEA teams will take part in 14 non-conference games on the weekend, as Providence College and Connecticut head for the North Country to take on Clarkson and No. 5 ranked St. Lawrence.

The Friars are coming off a weekend sweep of Maine, while UConn lost a pair of Hockey East league games last weekend at UNH and Northeastern. PC sophomore goalie Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) has picked up where she left off last season, posting a 0.50 GAA and .971 save percentage in two games this year. The Huskies owned a 9-4-1 non-conference record last season, as they play their next six games against non-league foes.

The Terriers will look to build on their eight non-conference wins last season as they host Robert Morris on Friday night. BU tied a pair of games last weekend with Ohio State, scoring four goals the game on Saturday. Northeastern, who is coming off an exciting shootout win vs. UConn last Sunday, will faceoff against Robert Morris on Saturday afternoon.

Boston College and No. 3 New Hampshire will host Colgate and Syracuse on the weekend. The Eagles will square off with the Orange on Friday at Chestnut Hill, while the Wildcats will entertain the Red Raiders that same night at the Whittemore Center in Durham. The Eagles tied and lost to Clarkson last week, but they will look to get back on the winning track this weekend. BC downed Colgate in their meeting last year by a score of 3-1 in Hamilton, N.Y. on January 2. UNH scored seven goals last weekend in its victories against UConn and Quinnipiac, while only allowing one tally. Junior netminder Kayley Herman (Weyburn, Sask.) notched 13 saves for her 12th career shutout for the Wildcats on Sunday.

Vermont will host Union College for a two-game set beginning on Friday night at Gut-terson Fieldhouse. The Catamounts swept Union last year in Schenectady by a combined score of 10-3. This weekend begins a streak of eight straight home games for UVM. The 'Cats are coming off a 2-1 overtime loss to McGill University last Sunday.

Maine will entertain Minnesota State over the weekend at Alfond Arena for a pair of contests. Senior forward Jenna Ouellette (Winnipeg, Man.) currently leads the league in scoring with eight points (1g,7a) in four games for the Black Bears this season.
