PROVIDENCE HOSTS NO. 9 NORTHEASTERN; BC TRAVELS TO VERMONT ~No. 4 UNH hosts RPI: WHEA All-Stars entertain U.S. National Team Sunday in Durham~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - In a light weekend on the WHEA schedule, No. 9 ranked Northeastern travels to faceoff with Providence College on Friday night at Schneider Arena. while the Boston College Eagles head north for a single-game at Vermont on Friday night at Gutterson Fieldhouse. No. 4 New Hampshire will host ECAC foe Rensselaer on Saturday (5pm) at the Whittemore Center. On Sunday, UNH's Whittemore Center will also play host to the WHEA All-Stars and the U.S. National Team for a exhibition game at 1pm.

The Friars and NU Huskies will meet for the second time this season, after PC earned a shootout win in their last meeting on Nov. 8, after the teams were tied 1-1 through 65 minutes. The game features two of the leagues top goalies in PC's Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) and NU's Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland). Schelling notched 37 saves in the shootout loss, while Lacasse stopped 28 shots in their previous meeting. Schelling's 0.81 GAA and .970 save percentage are both currently best among Div. 1 goaltenders.

Vermont and Boston College will meet for the third and final time in their regular-season series this year. The teams split a series back on Nov. 6 and 7 at Conte Forum. BC shutout the Catamounts in the series opener, 3-0, but UVM responded the next day with a 5-1 victory. BC freshman goalie Corinne Boyles (Wheaton, Ill.) owns the second best save percentage in the league with a .936 mark and her 2.07 GAA is fourth best among WHEA netminders.

The Wildcats are coming off a 1-1 tie at Harvard on Wednesday night at the Bright Center in Cambridge. UNH currently owns a 4-1-3 record in eight non-league games this season. UNH has outscored their opponents by a score of 13-2 in their four non-league wins this season. Micaela Long (South Boston, Mass.) and Kelly Paton (Woodstock, Ont.) have both posted a league best 22 points this season for the Wildcats.

BC's Katie King will serve as the head coach of the WHEA All-Stars on Sunday. Two WHEA alumni and two current WHEA players are featured on the USA roster, including BC's Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, Ohio) and Molly Schaus. UNH alum Kacey Bellamy will also make her return to the Whittemore Center, along with PC's Karen Thatcher. The Boston University Terriers had a league-high five student-athletes named to the WHEA roster, while Boston College and Connecticut both had four members named to the team. In the first meeting between the WHEA All-Stars and the U.S. National Team, Team USA was victorious by a score of 5-2 back on Dec. 11, 2005 at the Whittemore Center.
