## FOUR SKATING STRIDES GAMES ON CAMPUSES HIGHLIGHT WEEKEND SCHEDULE ~BU visits Vermont for two; UConn hosts Maine; BC, PC play home-and-home series~

**WAKEFIELD, Mass.** – Boston University will play at two-game set at Vermont beginning on Friday night at Gutterson Fieldhouse in Burlington, while No. 8 ranked Connecticut will host the Maine Black Bears starting Friday night at Freitas Ice Forum. Boston College and No. 9 Providence College will engage in a home-and-home series beginning on Saturday afternoon at Schneider Arena. Northeastern will head west to Niagara for the weekend, the series begins Saturday night.

Four Skating Strides games will take place this weekend with all the money being donated to local breast cancer charities around New England. The four games are as follows: Friday, Vermont at BU; Saturday, Maine at UConn and Boston College at Providence; Sunday, Providence at BC.

The Terriers shutout the Catamounts (4-0) in the first meeting of the season on Nov. 11 at Walter Brown Arena. BU is in the midst of a four-game unbeaten streak (2-0-2) coming into this weekend's play. UVM senior Chelsea Furlani (Colchester, Vt.; 46 career pts.) became the school's all-time leading scorer with a goal on Sunday vs. UConn.

UConn is unbeaten in its last six games (5-0-1) coming into the weekend with Maine. The Huskies most recently swept a two-game set at Vermont last weekend, scoring nine goals in the two contests. The Black Bears have won three of their last five games, which included a 3-1 loss to league-leader Northeastern last Friday night in Orono.

The Friars are coming off a huge weekend sweep of New Hampshire, while BC lost to arch rival BU on Tuesday night at Walter Brown Arena. PC owns a eight-game unbeaten streak (6-0-2), which is the second longest active streak in Div. I women's hockey. Sophomore netminder Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ont.) has won her last five starts and has posted a 1.40 GAA and a .948 save percentage during that time. BC senior forward Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, Minn.) is the second leading active scorer in the league with 126 career points in 130 career games as an Eagle.

Northeastern heads into the weekend at Niagara with a 6-1-0 record in non-league play this season. The Huskies are coming off a shootout win at UNH on Wednesday night, as Florence Schelling (Oberengstringen, Switzerland) stopped 28 shots by the Wildcats.
