UCONN, PROVIDENCE LOOK TO CONTINUE UNBEATEN STREAKS THIS WEEKEND ~UNH heads to Maine for series: Vermont travels south to PC. UConn~

WAKEFIELD. Mass. – No. 5 ranked New Hampshire will take a trip north to Orono for the weekend to face Maine for a two-game match up at Alfond Arena, while the Vermont Catamounts head south for the weekend, beginning Friday night at No. 9 Providence College and concluding the weekend Saturday at No. 8 Connecticut. Boston University will also host UConn on Friday night and Providence will head to Cambridge to faceoff with ECAC foe Harvard on Saturday night.

The Wildcats will look to get back on the winning track after going winless in their last three league contests. Maine is coming off a pair of losses at Connecticut last weekend in Storrs. UNH won the first meeting of the season series on Nov. 1 by a 5-0 score at the Whittemore Center in Durham. The Black Bears penalty kill ranks first in the league with a 91.8% kill rate in conference play this season. Senior forward Micaela Long (South Boston, Mass.) has 24 points (5g,19a) during her current 15-game point-scoring streak for the Wildcats. She has at least one assist each of the last six games. The Wildcats have won 12 straight games in the series and are unbeaten in 25 (23-0-2) dating back to Jan. 20, 2002, when the Black Bears were 2-1 victors in Durham.

The Catamounts are coming off a weekend split with the Terriers at Gutterson Fieldhouse, which included 2-1 overtime victory last Friday night, UVM will meet the Friars for the first time this season, after PC was victorious in the season series, 2-1, in 08-09. UConn won both meetings with UVM, two weekends ago up in Burlington, by scores of 5-1 and 4-1. Providence is the league's hottest team as of late, as the Friars bring a 10-game unbeaten streak (8-0-2) into Friday's contest, which includes eight straight victories. In the last six games, PC has posted 23 goals in its last six contests (3.83 goals per game).

UConn also brings a eight-game unbeaten streak (7-0-1) to the table this weekend against BU and Vermont. The Huskies has won six straight contests and have allowed only six goals during that time.

The Friars will play their last non-league game of the season on Saturday vs. the Crimson, as they have gone 4-4-4 in 12 out of conference games this season.
