TOP FIVE SEEDS IN WHEA TOURNEY TO BE DECIDED IN REGULAR-SEASON WEEKEND FINALE ~UConn, NU meet; PC travels to UVM; UNH faces BC; BU entertains Maine~

WAKEFIELD. Mass. - The WHEA regular-season schedule comes to a close this weekend with the top five seeds in the playoffs still up for grabs, as the five teams at the top of the standings are separated by only two points. No. 7 ranked Connecticut and No. 8 Northeastern will meet this weekend for a two-game set beginning on Saturday afternoon at Freitas Ice Forum, while Providence will travel north to Vermont for a pair of contests at Gutterson Fieldhouse. No. 4 New Hampshire will play a home-and-home series with Boston College starting on Saturday at the Whittemore Center in Durham. Maine will also travel to Boston University for the weekend for a two-game series at Walter Brown Arena.

Northeastern won the first meeting of the season series back on October 4th by way of the shootout. UConn owns a 11-1-2 record in its last 13 games heading into the weekend, while NU is winless in its last six contests. UConn sophomore forward Monique Weber (Rogers, Minn.) was named Pure Hockey Player of the Week on Monday for her four-point (2g,2a) weekend against the Friars last week. UConn's Jennifer Chaisson (Cumberland, Ont.) has posted at least one point in the last five games, including 11 of the last 12 games.

The Friars have dropped a game to the Catamounts in each of the past three seasons, which included the first meeting of the season series earlier this year on January 29, a 2-1 UVM win at Schneider Arena. PC owns the all-time series, 18-3, vs. the Catamounts. Coming into the final weekend of the regular season, sophomore Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) and junior Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) both are one point away from the 50-point milestone in their careers. Vermont senior goalie Kristen Olychuck (Kelowna, B.C.) ranks fifth among WHEA netminders with 393 saves in league play this season.

UNH senior forward Kelly Paton (Woodstock, Ont.) has recorded a point in seven consecutive games (4g,7a) for the Wildcats. UNH will win at least a share of the league regular-season title for the seventh consecutive year with two victories this weekend. The Wildcats have won each of the last four meetings and are unbeaten in nine consecutive games (8-0-1) since the Eagles' 7-2 win at Conte Forum on Nov. 2, 2006.

The Terriers won the first meeting of the series this year via shootout against Maine in Lewiston on November 24. BU is unbeaten in its last five games headed into the weekend. The Black Bears penalty kill ranks third in league play at 87.3% this season. BU senior forward Melissa Anderson (Langley, B.C.) has scored a point in four of her last five games with six points (5g,1a) in that stretch.
