Junior Forward; Richmond Hills, Ont.

Ryan Tverberg played a vital role for the Huskies over the past month, helping UConn to the best start in program history at 7-1-1. The junior scored seven goals and added four assists for 11 points, including three power-play goals and one game-winning strike. He led Hockey East with 11 overall points and seven goals and recorded at least one point in all but one of UConn's nine games.

Hutson most recently scored the final two goals of the game in a 2-1 OT win over No. 18 UMass Lowell. He has also blocked 11 shots, which is more than any one defender with at least eight points.

Terness finished the month of October with a 4-0-1 record with only six goals allowed. The sophomore wrapped the month with a 1.18 goals against average and a .946 save percentage, good enough to sit second in the nation in both categories. He is one of three goalies in the nation with zero losses in more than four games played. He won all three Hockey East games he started and pitched a 43-save shutout against Ohio State.
