The Women's Hockey East Association proudly enters its ninth season of play after officially commencing league action in the fall of 2002. In eight short years, the conference has emerged as one of the top women's ice hockey conferences in the nation, having sent three teams to the Frozen Four and nine teams to the NCAA Tournament in the league's eight-year existence, including most recently New Hampshire's Frozen Four appearance in 2008. In 2010, the Boston University Terriers earned the first their WHEA Tournament Championship in school history with a 2-1 overtime win against

Connecticut. Providence College hosted the eighth annual tournament championship at Schneider Arena as the top seed in the tournament, claiming their third regular-season championship in school history.

UNH's Kelly Paton and Northeastern's Florence Schelling were named Co-Player of the Year in the conference, while Wildcat forward Kristina Lavoie was tabbed at Rookie of the Year. Providence College's Bob Deraney earned WHEA Coach of the Year honors for the first time in his Friars coaching

Northeastern's Katy Applin, BU's Jennifer Arms UNH's Katie Brock and Chelsea Furlani from Vermont all earned 4.0 GPA's on the year to earn Hockey East Top-Scholar Athlete honors headlining the list of a league-record 71 student-athletes named to the WHEA All-Academic Team in 2009-2010. Applin and Arms received the distinction for second consecutive season.

Fenway Park hosted the first outdoor women's game in NCAA history on Friday, January 8, 2010. New Hampshire earned a 5-3 come from behind

victory in the game vs. Northeastern.

In February 2007, the league debuted its inaugural "Skating Strides Against Breast Cancer". The one-day event was hosted by Hockey East schools as a way to establish a greater fan base, to raise needed funds, and to work with the specific charities to raise awareness for both the league and the specific cause. In the initial year, close to \$20,000 was donated back to local breast cancer charities (Friends of Mel's Foundation and the American Cancer Society), vastly exceeding expectations. Last year, over \$23,000 dollars was raised to bring the four-year total to over \$114,000. "Skating Strides" has won two national awards at NACMA in the "Single Day Attendance Promotion" category in 2007 and 2009. The fourth annual "Skating Strides Against Breast Cancer" will have an event on every WHEA campus this season, as well as participation by all of the Hockey East men's teams.

History

Ás women's ice hockey steadily expanded from its original status as an emerging sport to its current status as an established NCAA championship sport, it became apparent that Hockey East should seriously consider sponsoring a separate league to accommodate its five member schools that initially had varsity programs for women: Boston College, Maine, New Hampshire, Northeastern and Providence. The uncertainty remained until a split in the Eastern College Athletic Conference grouped the five aforementioned programs into a separate league, the ECAC Women's Eastern League, along

with three other unaffiliated programs. Seeking league solidarity, administrators from the five Hockey East institutions acted.

In September of 2001, the long-incubated idea became a reality when the athletic directors voted to found the new women's league under the existing Hockey East banner, with play scheduled to begin no later than the 2004-05 season. The five schools with varsity programs entered as charter members with the stipulation that any other Hockey East school that added a varsity women's program in the future would be freely admitted to the

Expediting the process in the interests of the participating teams, the league and the sport itself, Commissioner Joe Bertagna worked with a selected task force to successfully prepare the Hockey East women's league for launch in the 2002-03 season, two years ahead of schedule. An important part of that process was the acceptance of an invitation extended to the University of Connecticut to join the newly formed league as its sixth active

The triumphant effort immediately afforded the participating administrators a stronger voice in the advancement of their women's ice hockey programs and alleviated the ECAC of continuing the maintenance of the Women's Eastern League. Players, fans, coaches and administrators alike were all anticipating the intensified competition created by the new circle of teams that were already familiar rivals.

In 2005, the Women's Hockey East Association welcomed the addition of two more teams to its growing family, Boston University and the University

of Vermont. For BU, it marked the inaugural season for women's hockey as a varsity sport.

Although the Women's Hockey East Association is still in its infancy, its member programs have storied histories that include several championships and individual awards at the highest levels of play. The first 14 ECAC championships were shared among New Hampshire, Northeastern and Providence, all charter members of Hockey East. Northeastern forward Brooke Whitney was named the recipient of the 2002 Patty Kazmaier Award as the nation's top female collegiate player, an honor first won by New Hampshire's Brandy Fisher in 1998. Had the award been in existence beforehand, it surely would have been won at some point by Cammi Granato, a three-time ECAC Player of the Year who led Providence to back-to-back championships in 1992 and 1993. Five years later, in 1998, alongside nine other alums of what are now Hockey East programs, Granato captained Team USA to the Olympic gold medal during the first Olympic tournament that featured women's ice hockey as a medal sport. Granato will be inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in October for her contributions to the sport. Beginning in 2009, the WHEA athletic directors voted to honor the league Player of the Year with the Cammi Granato Award.

Perhaps the proudest legacy that the Women's Hockey East Association has established is the Hockey Humanitarian Award. The most prestigious office honor, and arguably the highest overall honor in the sport, the Hockey Humanitarian Award recognizes college hockey's finest citizen each year and encompasses both male and female athletes in all divisions. Its winners have demonstrated outstanding contributions to society through leadership in charity work and volunteerism. Northeastern senior forward Missy Elumba was the 2009 recipient, as the fifth Hockey East student-athlete to receive the prestigious honor. Elumba was the 14th all-time recipient and joined former Husky goaltender Chanda Gunn, who received the award in 2004, as the second athlete in Northeastern women's hockey history. BC's Sarah Carlson received it in 2005, making Women's Hockey East the first league to boast back-to-back winners.

2011 WOMEN'S HOCKEY EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

The regular season will determine the six teams that qualify for the Hockey East Championship Tournament. The league athletic directors voted to expand the tournament field to six teams at the annual conference meetings in Naples, Fla. in April of 2008. The third and fourth seeds in the tournament will host a quarterfinal round game on Saturday, February 26 or Sunday, February 27 on their respective campuses.

The advancing teams will then be reseeded with the top two seeds to play on the site of the highest seed in the semifinal round on Saturday, March 4. The winners will qualify for the nine annual Hockey East Championship Game on Sunday, March 6.

COMMISSIONER JOE BERTAGNA



Joe Bertagna is the longest serving commissioner in the history of Hockey East. Now in his 29th year as a college hockey administrator, Bertagna has carved out a unique career in the sport he first played as a freshman goalie at Harvard University

in 1969.

After spending 15 years as the primary ice hockey administrator the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), Bertagna became Hockey East's fourth commissioner on July 1, 1997. A native of Arlington, Massachusetts, Bertagna began working at the ECAC in 1982, when he was named Tournament Director. He was later named Executive Director of Ice Hockey and then became Ice Hockey Commissioner in 1991. In these roles, he administered regular season and tournament play for 90 men's and women's varsity programs. His accomplishments at the ECAC included the league's first television package, the first hockey-

only corporate sponsorships, and the establishment of the first U.S. women's intercollegiate ice hockey leagues.

Bertagna made his mark immediately at Hockey East, engineering a multi-year television deal (SportsChannel New England) in his first month on the job. Shortly thereafter, league tournament attendance rocketed forward.

leading to the event's first-ever sellout in 2000. Bertagna was also instrumental in bringing about the formation of the Hockey East Women's League, just as he initiated league play for both Division I and Division III women's programs while with the ECAC.

Hockey East has enjoyed unparalleled success on the ice during Bertagna's tenure, winning five national championships, including the last three, and regularly enjoying post-season accolades for many of its student-athletes. Five of the last six players recognized as "Hobey Hat Trick" honorees have come from Hockey East, as did last season's National Rookie of the Year, Stephane DaCosta of Merrimack College.

Media coverage has soared in this period, as evidenced by the 2009-2010 ESPNU College Hockey schedule, which included Hockey East in 10 of 12 televised games. For the 2010-11 season, Hockey East games will be carried by CBS College

Sports nationally and by the New England Sports Network (NESN) locally. Bertagna also oversaw the signing of the first regional radio contract for the Hockey East Championships when the Boston Bruins' flagship station, "98.5, the Sports Hub," broadcast the 2010 championships from the TD Garden.

In January of 2010, Bertagna and his staff administered the first outdoor college hockey game in the East when Boston's fabled Fenway Park hosted a Hockey East doubleheader. The event, which sold out on the first day of public sale in September of 2009, was an unprecedented success for the conference, both financially and in terms of exposure. The game was carried live on both NESN and the NHL Network.

Nationally, Bertagna has served as the Executive Director of the American Hockey Coaches Association since 1991, the only person to serve in that capacity. In that role, he has overseen the growth of AHCA membership from fewer than 300 members in 1992 to over 1,400 members today. He also served a four-year term on the NCAA Ice Hockey Rules Committee, the final two years as chairman. He also serves

on the Board of Directors of USA Hockey and the Hockey Humanitarian Award Foundation.

Perhaps his biggest contributions on the national scene have come in his continuing role with

launched a number of initiatives that have helped grow the game on the national and international levels. In recent years, Bertagna was instrumental in securing funds for the formation of College Hockey, Inc., the marketing arm of the HCA, which was established in

2009. Beyond his college hockey accomplishments, Bertagna has forged an international reputation as a student and coach of goaltending. No one in North America is respected more for his contributions to the study of the position. Ralph "Cooney" Weiland and Bill Cleary at Harvard. A two-year starter at Harvard (1971-72 and 1972-73), Bertagna led the Ivy League with a 2.45 GAA in 1972. After Harvard, Bertagna played professionally for the Milwaukee Admirals and in Cortina, Italy. While in Italy, he led his S.G. Cortina d'Ampezzo squad to the 1975 Italian Championship.

Bertagna began his professional coaching career in 1985 with the Boston Bruins, staying with the Bruins as the goaltender coach until 1991 and rejoining the team for the 1994-95 season. He also has coached with Team USA (1991 Canada Cup and 1994 Winter Olympics) and with the Milwaukee Admirals (1994-96). Bertagna has operated his own goalie clinics since 1973, and in that time, has coached thousands of goalies of all ages throughout New England. He continues to speak on the subject for USA Hockey throughout the United States. Through his camps, lectures, print materials and DVDs, he has influenced the teaching of young goaltenders more than any other goaltending coach in the United States.

He has authored a number of instructional books and videos/DVDs on goaltending and edited "Crimson in Triumph", a book dedicated to Harvard athletic history. He also edited two successful issues of "Not The Boston Globe," a newspaper parody sold throughout New England in the mid-1980's. His creative skills have also led him into video production, freelance writing and producing highlight tapes for Harvard University and the Boston Bruins. He continues to contribute to the college hockey community as a writer.

Bertagna enjoyed a brief college coaching career at Harvard University in the late 1970's, serving as Men's Junior Varsity Coach in 1976-77 and launching Harvard's women's ice hockey program in 1977-78. He served as head coach of Harvard Women's Hockey for two seasons

Kathy Wynters – Associate Commissioner



Kathy Wynters is entering her fifth season as Associate Commissioner, seventeenth year overall with the conference. As Joe Bertagna's chief assistant, her primary responsibilities include the day-to-day operations of both the men's and women's leagues, along with the administration of tournaments and special events, marketing and branding initiatives, and the licensing and sponsorship programs. Prior to her promotion, Wynters served Hockey East as Director of Marketing and Special Events from 2002-06.

Wynters was the driving force behind the creation of both "Skating Strides Against Breast Cancer" and the Hockey East Kids' Club. In four years, the Skating Strides program has raised nearly \$114,000 for breast cancer awareness and research, while at the same time increased attendance at women's hockey games and gave the student-athletes the opportunity to give back to the communities

in which they study and play hockey. "Skating Strides" was nationally recognized twice (2007 & 2009) by NACDA/NACMA with medals for "Single Day Attendance Promotion of an Olympic Sport".

During Kathy's tenure, the Hockey East corporate sponsorship program has grown to include several new partnerships, many breaking ground beyond traditional hockey companies. In addition, the Hockey East licensing program has also expanded to include many new licensees, as well as increased revenues from licensed merchandise, including an expanded offering at the conference championships. Kathy was instrumental in both the marketing efforts and logistical operations behind Hockey East's 25th Anniversary Celebration during the 2008-09 season, and the Frozen Fenway events in January 2010.

Wynters previously served Hockey East as Assistant Commissioner during the late 80's and early 90's, before going on to work for the New Jersey Devils in the NHL, spending three years as a Marketing Director, coordinating licensing and souvenir merchandising. Wynters also spent five years as marketing manager for PictureTel Corporation. A native of Quincy, MA, the former Kathy Walsh earned a B.S. degree in marketing from Providence College in 1982. She began her career while an undergraduate, as a three-year intern with the men's hockey team. Following graduation, she served the Friars first as Assistant Sports Information Director (primary men's hockey contact) and then as Director of

Athletic Marketing.

While at PC, and before Hockey East had a full-time staff, Wynters worked with former PC athletic director, and then Commissioner, Lou Lamoriello on the launch of the conference in 1983, and then coordinated the first three Hockey East championship tournaments (1985-87). She also managed the 1986 NCAA Men's Frozen Four at the Providence Civic Center, co-hosted by Brown University and Providence College. In 1988, Wynters left her position at PC and moved over to Hockey East on a full-time basis. Among her earlier accomplishments at Hockey East, Wynters worked with Joe Bertagna in coordinating the first and only "Hockeyfest" events, combining the ECAC and Hockey East championships into single weekend events from 1989-91.

Kathy and her husband Chuck (a retired on-ice official for Hockey East), are the parents of two teenagers: daughter Annie (18), a freshman at Holy Cross and son C.J. (17), a high school senior. The Wynters family resides in Waltham.

The Terriers will also add eight newcomers to the team this year's squad, including freshman Marie-Philip Poulin, a highly touted incoming recruit from Beauceville, Que. to go along with transfer Jenn Wakefield. The Terriers return seven of their top eight scorers, which includes Lauren Cherewyk (29 pts.), Jill Cardella (27) and Jillian Kirchner 26. The Terriers will have to replace WHEA Tournament MVP Melissa Haber with sophomore Alissa Fromkin or incoming fresh-

man Kerrin Sperry, a North Reading, Mass. native.

The Eagles will receive a huge boost this year with the return of seniors Kelli Stack, a two-time WHEA Player of the Year, and Molly Schaus, a two-time WHEA All-Conference netminder, to the BC roster, after spending the year with the silver-medal winning U.S. Women's National Team at Vancouver, B.C. Katie King's program has a very solid nucleus of returner's, which also includes Ashley Motherwell and Mary Restuccia up front. Boston College has 74% of it's offense intact from a year ago with 15 letterwinners returning and a league low three letterwinners lost.

Providence College is fresh off it's third WHEA regularseason title in school history with 11 wins in conference play in 2009-10. The Friars return their top 5 scorers and All-League goaltender Genevieve Lacasse. Bob Deraney's team will again have a great balance of offense and defense and that should keep them right in the mix at the top of the WHEA league standings. Ashley Cottrell lead's the way on offense for the Friars, her 22 points last season in league play was third best among WHEA skaters and she was named the WHEA All-Conference First-Team for her efforts.



CAMMI GRANATO PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

This honor is awarded by the head coaches to a player from those nominated for consideration, which was renamed the Cammi Granato Player of the Year Award in the fall of 2008. The player receiving this recognition has demonstrated superior play and leadership for her team. Granato had a legendary four-year career at Providence College, establishing many scoring records for the Friars (139 goals in 99 games). She captured ECAC Player of the Year honors in three consecutive years from 1991-93, while leading the team to back-to-back conference titles in 1992 and 1993. A 15-year member of the U.S. Women's National Team beginning in 1990, Granato is the program's all-time scoring leader. She achieved international fame by captaining Team USA to the gold medal at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games.

Paton and Schelling were unanimous WHEA First-Team All-Star selections for their outstanding play this season and were also named Top-10 Patty Kazmaier finalists. Paton posted a career-high 51 points in her senior season, which included 32 points in league play, which was second best among league skaters. She earned WHEA Player of the Month honors a league-high three times this season. Paton tallied a point in 27 of 31 games with 12 multiple-point efforts on the season. Schelling was crowned the Bauer Goaltending Champion with a 1.50 GAA and .946 save percentage in league play for the Huskies, leading the team to a school best second place finish in the conference standings. She ranked tied for third in the NCAA with a .949 save percentage and ranks fifth in GAA (1.37). Schelling was named WHEA Goaltender of the Month for October and November and she was honored as WHEA Defensive Player of the Week a league best seven times in 2009-10.

The Hockey East All-Stars faced the 2010 U.S. National Team at **UNH's Whittemore Center**

The Women's Hockey East Association, in conjunction with USA Hockey and the University of New Hampshire, host the second WHEA All-Star game on Sunday, November 22, at UNH's Whittemore Center, as part of Team USA's Qwest Tour. The tour is designed to pit the U.S. Women's National Team against elite-level competition in preparation for the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C. The top players from each of the eight Hockey East teams will be selected to represent the league in an All-Star-style competition against the 2010 U.S. National Team, which won a silver medal at the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver, B.C. Team USA's roster had a great showing of WHEA alums and current players including: UNH alum Kacey Bellamy, Boston College's Molly Schuas and Kelli Stack, along with PC alum Karen Thatcher. BC head coach Katie King served as the WHEA All-Stars head coach.

Nov. 22, 2009 recap: Hockey East put up a good fight and held Team USA to their lowest goal output of the Qwest Tour, with only four goals. Despite the 4-0 loss, WHEA was also able to stop all power play attempts as Team USA went 0-6 on the power play. Northeastern's Florence Schelling was named the Hockey East All-Stars Player of the Game with her standout performance in goal, stopping 19 of the 20 shots she faced.

Dec. 11, 2005 recap: The WHEA All-Stars jumped out to a surprising 2-0 first-period lead thanks to goals by Boston University's Cara Hendry and Maine defenseman Kelly Law. But the National Team came storming back with two goals in the first 2:07 of the second period and it was a dogfight the rest of the way. Team USA got the bulk of the shots-on-goal, and finally grabbed the lead midway through the third when former Harvard star Angela Ruggiero got the first of two quick goals leading the team to a 5-2 victory. UConn goalie Kaitlyn Shain was impressive against the high-powered Olympians, stopping 41 shots, while former Northeastern All-American Chanda Gunn was in net for Team USA and finished with 10 saves. This Hockey East Team is probably the college team that extended us the most," said former Team USA" coach Ben Smith, UConn's Heather Linstad, the senior member of women's Hockey East coaching fraternity served as head coach of the All-Star squad.


