HOCKEY EAST HEADLINES

For the first time ever, all 10 Hockey East programs will participate in the Women's Tournament. In 2021-22, the Hockey East Army ROTC women's league standings and tournament seeding was determined by points percentage, calculated as the amount of points won divided by the total amount of points available to each team. Hockey East awards three points for a win in regulation, two points for a win in overtime or a shootout, one point for a loss in overtime or a shootout and zero points for a loss in regulation.

The two most crucial series of the weekend proved to be Maine's sweep of New Hampshire and Boston University's two-game set with Providence. With eight of the 10 seeds locked up entering the final regular season game of the season, the Friars played spoiler by taking two points from the Terriers and knocking BU into the sixth spot in the Army ROTC Hockey East Standings. At the same time, Maine's six points, powered by two goals and three assists from **Celine Tedenby**, secured the fifth seed for the Black Bears.

Northeastern's **Skylar Fontaine's** 36 assists lead the nation. She finished the regular season with 29 assists in league play, the most ever in a single-season by a Hockey East defender. She ends her career with records for most career goals (35), assists (82), points (117), and single-season assists (29) in conference action by a league blueliner.

Fontaine's teammate **Aerin Frankel** leaves her mark on Hockey East regular season record books, winning 73 conference games, the most of any goaltender in league history.

Holy Cross netminder **Jada Brenon** set a new career mark for saves in Hockey East play, stopping 2668 pucks in conference action. Brenon also holds the single-season mark, kicking out 832 in 2019-20 season.

HOCKEY EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

TERESA SCHAFZAHL VERMONT

Theresa Schafzahl (Sr., F; Weiz, Austria) had three goals and two assists as the Catamounts earned five points at Boston College on the final weekend of the season to secure the second seed in the Hockey East Tournament. Schafzahl also scored in the shootout Friday night at BC. With two goals and an assist Saturday she became UVM's all-time single season leader in goals (23) and points (43).



CELINE TEDENBY MAINE

Celine Tedenby (Sr., F; Ornskoldsvik, Sweden) potted a pair of goals in a 4-1 victory over rival UNH on Friday and followed up with three assists in a 5-0 victory on Saturday for a total of five points on the weekend. Her offensive output helped Maine secure the five seed in the Hockey East Tournament.



PRO AMBITIONS ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

CALLIE SHANAHAN BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Callie Shanahan (Fr., G; Commerce, Mich.) made 42 saves in a fantastic performance at Providence, helping BU earn a 1-1 tie. Shanahan made several key stops, including one on a point-blank, wide-open chance in front of the net with about a minute remaining in overtime.



HOCKEY EAST DEFENDER OF THE WEEK

TEGHAN INGLIS MERRIMACK

Teghan Inglis (Jr., D; Okotos, Alta.) was key for Merrimack's weekend sweep. She had a three point weekend, notching two goals in Friday's game to take over the team goal lead with 12 tallies on the year. She also notched a primary assist on the team's second goal in Saturday's contest. This is her third three-point weekend of the season.



HOCKEY EAST GOALTENDER OF THE WEEK

EMMA GORSKI MERRIMACK

Emma Gorski (Jr., G; Wallaceburg, Ont.) earned two straight wins against the Crusaders, only allowing three goals in two games. Her efforts were key in the penalty kill going for a combined 8-for-8 over the series, including five penalty kills in Saturday's game. The junior turned a total of 50 saves over the weekend.



HOCKEY EAST WEEKLY TOP PERFORMERS

Lacey Martin, BU (So., F; Minnetonka, Minn.) Scored the overtime winner in the Terriers' 3-2 comeback win over Maine on Tuesday as part of her two-point performance against the Black Bears.

Alex Allan, BU (Sr., D; Abbotsford, B.C.) Netted the game's opening goal in a 1-1 tie at Providence on Friday night and also had an assist in the 3-2 OT win over Maine on Tuesday. Allan finished the week as a plus-3 and blocked two shots.

Darci Johal, HC (Jr., F; Burnaby, B.C.) Had a goal in each of Holy Cross' contests this weekend against Merrimack to extend her goal-scoring streak to four straight games. She has scored a goal in five of the last six contests, bringing her season total to 11.

Mira Seregely, ME (Fr., F; Budapest, Hungary) Picked up three points in a weekend sweep of UNH. She found the back of the net in each game and added an assist in Saturday's 5-0 victory.

Elise Morphy, ME (So., D; Regina, Sask.) Scored a goal in all three of Maine's games during the week; a 3-2 loss in overtime at BU and a pair of victories over UNH. All three tallies came on the power play and it included the game-winning score in Friday's 4-1 win.

Jorden Mattison, ME (So., G; Fenwick, Ont.) Compiled a 2-1-0 record during the week, including her first career shut-out with 24 saves on Saturday in a 5-0 win over New Hampshire. She totaled 81 saves during the three outings.

Hannah Corneliusen, MC (So., F; Warroad, Minn.) Enjoyed a three-point weekend for the Warriors, including the team's game-winning goal against Holy Cross on Friday. She posted the primary assist on Teghan Inglis' opening goal in Friday's game before adding another primary helper in the game's first goal by Gabby Jones in the team's win on Saturday.

Maureen Murphy, NU (Sr., F; Buffalo, N.Y.) Tallied five points off four assists and one goal to help lead Northeastern to a 2-0-1 week. Murphy had two multi-assist games against New Hampshire and UConn on Saturday. Her 46 points and 24 goals currently lead all Hockey East players

Skylar Fontaine, NU (Gr., D; East Greenwich, R.I.) Potted one goal and three assists over three games to help Northeastern to a 2-0-1 week. Fontaine's 36 assists lead the nation and her lone goal of the week was the game-winner against UNH. Fontaine finished the regular season with 29 assists in league play, the most ever in a single-season by a Hockey East defender. She ends her career with records for most career goals (35), assists (82), points (117), and single-season assists (29) by a league blueliner.

Aerin Frankel, NU (Gr., G; Briarcliff Manor, N.Y.) Started all three games in goal for the Huskies, ending the week with 84 saves and a 2-0-1 record. Frankel posted a 32-save shutout against UConn on Saturday for her NCAA-best 10th shutout of the season. Additionally, in the 4-4 tie at UConn on Friday, Frankel made two saves in the shootout to help Northeastern claim the extra Hockey East point. Frankel ends her regular-season career with 73 wins in league play, the most of any Hockey East netminder.

NEWS & NOTES

The Opening Round begins Wednesday, Feb. 23 as No.7 seed Providence (15-13-6/12-12-3 HE) hosts No. 10 Holy Cross (3-29-0/1-26-0 HE) at Schneider Arena. It will be the first-ever post season meeting between the Friars and the Crusaders. Providence has never lost to Holy Cross during the Crusaders' four-year tenure in Hockey East, posting a perfect 12-0-0 mark. This season, the two programs duelled three straight times, including back-to-back overtime victories for Providence. Holy Cross is 0-1 all time in the Hockey East Tournament while Providence claims a 19-21 mark.

No. 8 New Hampshire (11-20-2/9-16-1 HE) makes its 19th appearance in the Hockey East postseason and will play No. 9 Merrimack (7-24-1/6-20-1 HE) for the first-time ever in the tournament. The Wildcats are tied for the most Tournament titles of any league program with four, their last coming in 2009. The Warriors enter the Hockey East Tournament for the third time in program history and searching for their first postseason win. Merrimack went 1-2-0 against New Hampshire in 2021-22, including a 3-2 overtime win on Nov. 12, and two one-goal setbacks.

Northeastern (27-4-2/21-3-2 HE) claims the top seed in the Hockey East Tournament for the fourth straight year and are searching for an unprecedented fifth consecutive Bertagna Trophy as league champions. The Huskies will welcome the lowest remaining seed from the Opening Round. The other winner will travel north to Burlington to face the University of Vermont (21-10-3/18-7-2 HE), which finished second in the Army ROTC Hockey East Standings, the Catamounts' highest-ever regular season in Hockey East. The Huskies will play host at 7:30pm on Saturday, February 26 on NESN+, while the Catamounts are set to drop the puck at noon on the same day.

No. 3 UConn (22-8-4/16-7-4 HE) earned the right to host a quarterfinal game and will welcome No. 6 Boston University (12-14-6/11-9-5 HE) to Freitas Ice Forum on Saturday, Feb. 26, just the third time the Huskies have finished third or better in the regular season standings. Boston University holds a 2-0 advantage over UConn all-time in the Hockey East Tournament, including a 2-1 overtime win in the 2010 title game. The Huskies are 14-20 in the league postseason while the Terriers boast a 25-13 mark.

No. 4 Boston College (19-13-1/16-9-1 HE) will take on No. 5 Maine (14-18-1/12-13-1 HE) at Conte Forum on Friday, Feb. 25 at 1:00pm in a quarterfinal match up. The Eagles look to advance to the semifinals for the first time since 2019 after last winning the Bertagna Trophy in 2017. Boston College is 3-0 all-time against the Black Bears in the Hockey East Tournament, all three victories coming in quarterfinal contests. Maine has appeared in the semifinals in three of the last four tournaments (2018, 2020, 2021) but has never advanced to the final in six attempts.

Semifinals are set tentatively set for 3:00pm and 6:30pm on Wednesday, March 2, while the Championship will be played Saturday, March 5 at 7:00pm live on NESN+ for just the second time ever. Tickets are available via the host institution for each game.
