Hockey East Names 2024-25 Pro Ambitions All-Rookie Team

Tournament Opening Round Begins Tonight at Campus Sites

AMESBURY, Mass. - The Hockey East Association today announced the 2024-25 Pro Ambitions All-Rookie Team and five other season-long awards as voted by the women's league's 10 head coaches. The awards come as part of the celebration of the 23rd annual Hockey East Tournament, which begins tonight.

The 2024-25 Pro Ambitions All-Rookie Team consists of seven players, including three unanimous selections in UConn forward Claire Murdoch (Toronto, Ont.) and Northeastern defender Tuva Kandell (Leksand, Sweden) and her teammate goaltender Lisa Jönsson (Stockholm, Sweden). The team is rounded out by defender Olivia Maffeo (Canton, Mass./Boston College), and forwards Lauren Glaser (Marlboro, Mass./Boston College), Chloe Goofers (Leduc, Alta./Merrimack), and Eloise Caron (Saint-Hyacinthe, Que./Northeastern).

Also recognized for her efforts in the 2024-25 campaign is Boston University graduate student **Tamara Giaquinto** (Toronto, Ont.) who has been named Army ROTC Defender of the Year, the first Terrier to win the award since **Kasey Boucher** in 2011-12.

Two statistical awards have been formally announced, as Providence's **Reichen Kirchmair** (Oakville, Ont.) has captured the Hockey East scoring crown, netting 15 goals and adding 15 assists for 30 points. She is just the second Friar to ever claim the title and the first since **Kelli Halcisak** did so in the league's inaugural 2002-03 campaign. Boston College goaltender **Grace Campbell** (Kensington, Md.) has captured the Hockey East Three Stars Award, given to the player who accrues the most points from being named the first, second, or third star of the game throughout the season.

Providence graduate **Hannah Johnson** (Readfield, Maine) has been honored as the best defensive forward during the regular season. She becomes just the second Friar to win the award after **Sarah Hjalmarsson** in 2022-23.

Merrimack graduate forward **Raice Szott** (Daysland, Alb.) was awarded the conference's sportsmanship award. Szotti is a three-time nominee for the Hockey Humanitarian Award and has been a finalist each of the last two years.

The 2025 Hockey East Women's Tournament begins tonight with two Opening Round games. Holy Cross vists at Vermont at 6:00 p.m. on ESPN+ while Merrimack travels to New Hampshire at 7:00 p.m. on NESN. Winners will advance to the quarterfinals on March 1 to take on either UConn or Boston University.

The Hockey East semifinals are set for Wednesday, March 5 at campus sites. The 23rd championship game will be played Saturday, March 8 at 12:00 p.m. at UConn's Toscano Family Ice Forum and air nationally on ESPNEWS. Tickets are available via the host institution for each on-campus game and championship tickets can be purchased through HockeyEastOnline.com.

Hockey East will announce the 2024-25 All-Star Teams on Friday, February 28 at 10:00 a.m. The league will then announce finalists for the Player, Rookie, and Coach of the Year awards on Monday, March 3.
